



## "Our deepest wounds surround our greatest gifts"- Ken Page

Dear sisters and brothers,

How are you? We were all blessed to celebrate Holy Week this year with a good number of families and friends in our new church for the first time. I believe it was very uplifting for all of us. From this Sunday, we resume our morning tea after the morning Masses on Sundays. I ask you to please maintain social distancing in compliance with the restrictions still in place to keep everyone safe! This would be a wonderful opportunity for us to grow in our sense of belonging. We are in need of rebuilding our community and, sure with God's grace and His guidance, we will be able to rebuild our loving community. The gospel of this Sunday speaks about Thomas whom Jesus invited to touch his wounds and to grow in his faith. This Sunday, Jesus invites us to face our own wounds and that of others, to be healed and form one community of faith, love and justice.

A prominent Washington attorney died, a man who had lived a good life: solid, moral and trustworthy, a faithful husband and loving father. He had worked hard; his work ethic and professionalism were beyond reproach. When he died, he went to heaven where St. Peter greeted him at the gates of God's dwelling place. When the attorney asked if he could enter, Peter pulled out a sheet of paper. It was the man's resume of his many accomplishments. Peter nodded approvingly as he scanned the sheet, clearly impressed by what he saw — but then a frown settled on the saint's face. "But," Peter said, "I'm puzzled about one thing. Where are your wounds?" "What do you mean?" the distinguished guest said. "My wounds?" "Your wounds," Peter explained, "back down on earth. Did you see your city and nation, even your world, struggling through countless crises? Couldn't you recognize the pain in front of you as you moved around your city — people without homes and jobs, without health care, without hope? Couldn't you see the people around your city and country and world in desperate straits? Could you not be wounded, even a little, for the sake of all the wounds around you?" "Somehow, in the sharing of wounds, we come to see each other in a deeper way. No wonder the disciples recognized Jesus by his wounds."

Stanley Hauerwas is considered one of the great theologians in North America, yet he began his theological career as a sort of Doubting Thomas. In his recent memoir, Hannah's Child, he tells of a time in his life when he was reluctant to call himself a Christian. Then something happened as he was teaching at the University of Notre Dame. His wife, Ann, was diagnosed with bipolar disorder and treated without success.

For ten years, Hauerwas and their son, Adam, learned to live with the uncertainty and pain of Ann's illness. Ann's mind and behaviour were often uncontrollable but, through it, Hauerwas learned to face the limits of his own energy, to receive friendship and support from others, and in the process, he discovered what it means to be held together by the grace of God. It was by the sharing of wounds that he found the strength to carry on with his life and eventually to call himself a Christian. (Angelican Journal)

We are all wounded. Some of us carry wounds that are deeper and more intense than others. These wounds can

be physical or spiritual, recent or long-standing. An injection or a pill isn't enough to heal these wounds. Healing is an internal process that puts things right, and to do this we need to face our wounds.

As Henri Nouwen says, "only the wounded healer is really able to heal the wounds of others." As we recognize our own wounds, let us also come forward to heal the wounds of others in the Spirit of Love, Love of God.

### Bernadette Soubirous Feast Day:

16 April

Bernadette Soubirous

was born in 1844, the first child of an extremely poor miller in the town of Lourdes in southern France. The family was living in the basement of a dilapidated building when on February 11, 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette in a cave above the banks of the Gave River near Lourdes. Bernadette, 14 years old, was known as a virtuous girl though a dull student who had not even made her first Holy Communion. In poor health, she had suffered from asthma from an early age.

There were 18 appearances in all, the final one occurring on the feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, July 16. Although Bernadette's initial reports provoked skepticism, her daily visions of "the Lady" brought great crowds of the curious. The Lady, Bernadette explained, had instructed her to have a chapel built on the spot of the visions. There, the people were to come to wash in and drink of the water of the spring that had welled up from the very spot where Bernadette had been instructed to dig. According to Bernadette, the Lady of her visions was a girl of 16 or 17 who wore a white robe with a blue sash. Yellow roses covered her feet, a large rosary was on her right arm. In the vision on March 25 she told Bernadette, "I am the Immaculate Conception." It was only when the words were explained to her that Bernadette came to realize who the Lady was. Cont...


