Easter Sunday


“The story of Easter is the story of God’s wonderful window of divine surprise”

With the parish team I wish everyone of you a Happy Easter! Easter is the celebration of the rising of Jesus from the dead. Easter brings some new energy into our being and it makes us all new. Easter is always a beginning of a whole new way of looking at life and we, as Christians, look upon life with the eyes of the Risen Christ.

I read once of a little girl whose home was near a cemetery, and in order to go to the store, she had to follow a path that led through the cemetery. But this little girl never seemed to have any sense of fear, even when she returned through the cemetery at dusk. Someone said to her, "Aren't you afraid to go through the cemetery?" "Oh, no," she replied, "I'm not afraid, for my home is just beyond." Our home is just beyond the cemetery. This little girl is able to look at life with the eyes of the risen Christ.

I got a message through WhatsApp which reads, “ We fell asleep in one world, and woke up in another: suddenly Disney is out of magic, Paris is no longer romantic, New York doesn’t stand up anymore, the Chinese wall is no longer a fortress, and the big cathedrals, temples and Mecca are empty. Hugs and kisses suddenly become weapons and not visiting parents and friends physically becomes an act of love. Suddenly you realise that power, beauty, money are worthless, and can’t get you the oxygen you are fighting for... The world continues its life and it is beautiful. It only puts humans in cages. I think it is sending a message: The air, earth, water and sky without you are fine. When you come back, remember that you are my guests. Not my masters”. This anonymous person looks at the people places and the environment in the context of the Corona Pandemic. The way we relate to nature is challenged. But still, we are living in a wonderful world!



Even in the colossal loss of lives across the globe, we witness the courage, determination and the self-sacrificial love of the medical doctors, nurses and caregivers, and everyone else who put themselves on the line in the service of the people. They work day and night in view of flattening the curve of the infection spread. We see the presence of the Risen Christ in them and they are truly the Easter People.

Christ is truly present in those who are self- isolated and those who are reaching out to them and to the vulnerable in general. An ordinary Hindu man back home interpreted the fact of the closure of the churches, temples and mosques as God has left these holy grounds and He is busy in the hospitals and medical centres attending to the victims of the pandemic and in all the meetings and conferences directed towards protecting the people. The risen Christ is busy looking after us. Yes, there are various ways of realising the presence of Jesus in our midst. Even in the midst of pain and suffering, we can have a glimpse of hope and sing God’s praises. The reason is that we are both Good Friday and Easter people.

Patt Barnes came upon an old lady selling flowers on a busy city street. Her face was old and wrinkled, but radiant with an Easter smile. Patt took a flower, paid her, and said, "How happy you are this morning!" The flower lady replied, "Why not? Everything is beautiful." Patt was startled by her reply, because she was dressed so shabbily and looked so frail. Patt said: "You surely wear your troubles well! Again, her reply startled Patt: "When Jesus died Good Friday," she said, "that was the worst of days. Then, 3 days later--Easter! So, when troubles come my way, I simply wait three days. Then and everything gets all right again."

First Reading (Acts of the Apostles 10:34, 37-43)

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 117:1-2. 16-17. 22-23. R. v.24)

Second Reading (Colossians 3:1-4)

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Gospel (John 20:1-9)

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

On Good Friday we remember the crucifixion of Jesus together with two criminals. Today the death penalty is still used in many countries for the punishment of crimes. On 11 May 2018, Pope Francis approved a revision of the Catechism of the Catholic Church concerning the death penalty. 

I earnestly request our community to pray for all the sick in our parish community and beyond that this Easter can bring healing to them.


