### When you approach each moment with fresh eyes and an open heart, you are no longer defined by your past pain or your fears for the future"

Dear sisters and brothers,

Just five days to go for the celebration of Christmas. While many countries are locked down, we Australians are very fortunate and privileged to celebrate this significant event with the utmost responsibility of caring for one another and adhering to the regulations. I would like to bring a few things to your kind attention:

- Our parish is holding six Masses for Christmas in view of spreading out the worshippers across various Masses to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the wider community.
- There will be live music in all the Masses in compliance with the regulations. The Congregation is not expected to sing or chant unless they wear a mask. The musicians and singers have been well advised to adhere to the regulations and I am very grateful for every one of them for their tremendous effort to make the celebrations vibrant and lively with singing.
- I would highly recommend wearing of masks during the celebrations that everyone feels safe in and out of the church.
- We are in need of people to assist for a smooth running of celebrations through various ministries. Kindly jump on board and make Christmas COVID-free in our community.
- May I request everyone to cooperate with the welcomers and other volunteers who will marshal the registration of the attendees and other requirements.
- Make sure that you bring your registration tickets with you as you come for the celebration.
- If there is any query, you are most welcome to get in touch with the parish office and we will try our best to help you.

Here below is the reflection for this Sunday:

In Pope Francis' new encyclical on social friendship and dialogue, Fratelli Tutti, he speaks of the need for an open heart, explaining that such an interior disposition is key for building peace in our world. Mary's response to the angel in today's Gospel demonstrates the kind of openness that Pope Francis speaks of and that God desires of us.

Mary declares that she is open to welcoming Jesus; open to walking the hard path of discipleship that will lead to the death and resurrection of her Son; open to becoming the mother of all peoples.

What would it look like for us to have such a radical openness of heart towards God's will and toward love of neighbour? In Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis writes, "the guarantee of an authentic openness to God, on the other hand, is a way of practicing the faith that helps open our hearts to our brothers and sisters."

Our world and our country today are fraught with division. Hateful language, mean-spiritedness, and belittlement of others abound. It is these kinds of breakdown in human relationships that Pope Francis is addressing in his new encyclical. These patterns lead to violence and a culture of indifference.

In Fratelli Tutti, Pope Francis highlights the Good Samaritan story from the Gospel of Luke as means for understanding how we can arrive at the kind of "openness of heart" needed in today's fractured world. He understands the encounter in the story between the injured Jewish man and the Samaritan as not merely a single moment of charity but an encounter of mercy which leaves both individuals transformed. At the time of Luke's writing, Jews and Samaritans hated each other; such an encounter could only have left a deep mark on each of them and their understanding of the other's people.

Fr. Michael Bassano, MM, gives an example of the power of encounter in his ministry in a refugee camp in South Sudan: "The church isn't a place; it's a way of being together. So even though we're in a Nuer tribe area of the UN camp, we intentionally invited Shilluk and Dinka tribes from other areas of the camp, especially the youth, to come here. It's a place where diverse people come to become one people, worshipping God together. Every time we gather on Sunday for worship, we are a family of God, not divided by tribe, at peace with each other."

Today's Gospel reminds us that "Nothing is impossible for God." The barriers that divide people today sometimes seen unsurmountable. When we live in a world of alternative facts, of starkly different visions of reality and for the future, it can seem impossible to find common ground.

But as we leave the Season of Advent and celebrate Christmas next week, we are reminded that God enters through the smallest foothold: a baby born to a poor teenage girl in an obscure part of the world. God can create in us an open heart if we offer up the smallest bit of room. (Maryknoll Reflections)

### The Nativity of Our Lord

Feast Day: 25 December



On this day, the Church focuses especially on the newborn Child. God become human, who embodies for us all the hope and peace we seek. We need no other special saint today to lead us to Christ in the manger, although his mother Mary and Joseph, caring for his foster-son, help round out the scene. But if we were to select a patron for today, perhaps it might be appropriate for us to imagine an anonymous shepherd, summoned to the birthplace by a wondrous and even disturbing vision in the night, a summons from an angelic choir, promising peace and goodwill. A shepherd willing to seek out something that might just be too unbelievable to chase after, and yet compelling enough to leave behind the flocks in the field and search for a mystery.

On the day of the Lord's birth, let's let an unnamed, "non-celebrity" at the edge of the crowd model for us the way to discover Christ in our own hearts—somewhere between skepticism and wonder, between mystery and faith. And like Mary and the shepherds, let's treasure that discovery in our hearts.


