Dear sisters and brothers,

How are you?

There is certainly a feeling of restlessness among us as we have been in lockdown for a couple of months now. As we are used to a certain lifestyle, we feel that we are robbed of



couple of months now. As we are used to a certain lifestyle, we feel that we are robbed of our freedom and rights, and we whinge about many things. Just take a minute to look at the plight of the people in Afghanistan at the rise of the Taliban regime in addition to the impact of the pandemic and compare our situation here. Are we not blessed in various ways? When are we going to open our minds and hearts to realise our blessings, and to cooperate with each other to get to the other side of the pandemic as early as possible? In this regard, Pope Francis wants us to get vaccinated against COVID-19. "Getting the vaccine," the pontiff says, "is an act of love." "Thanks to God's grace and the work of many, we now have vaccines to protect us from COVID-19" ~Pope Francis (refer video on our parish Facebook page). "Getting vaccinated is a simple yet profound way to care for one another, especially the most vulnerable," he said. "I pray to God that each of us can make his or her own small gesture of love." The Vatican has been clear that COVID-19 vaccines are a moral good and acceptable for Catholics to take. A statement in December from the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith said the overarching moral mandate is to be vaccinated or do the utmost possible to avoid passing along the virus (Catholic World News). As we are at the crossroads of our life, we are to make a choice. How we choose, and what we decide will ultimately determine our destination. Shall we allow Jesus to be a part of every choice that we make, so we may embrace a good future? It is Jesus who gives meaning to our lives, even in the face of uncertainties, fears and anxieties created by this pandemic.

For the last six weeks, we have been reflecting on the 'food for life" that Jesus offers, i.e., his own body and blood. He was very strong and firm in telling the people "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his Blood you will not have life in you". This weekend we see the response of the people to this immortal truth. The hearers were stunned at this statement, and they could not stand this truth. They are being asked to make a choice, as we are, to choose to follow Jesus or not. Most of the hearers opted to be out of the company of Jesus. Turning to the chosen disciples, he asked "Do you want to leave too?" Fortunately, Peter, as the representative of the team, responded "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life". The same question is asked to us, believers, if we choose to adhere to Jesus and His Words in this troubling and challenging time in history?

A group of pilgrims were visiting Chartres Cathedral and its great labyrinth: the circular walkway outlined on the church floor that pilgrims and penitents have prayerfully "walked" for centuries.

An older man and woman stood near the entrance watching visitors slowly walk the labyrinth. Then the woman took off her shoes and handed them, with her purse, to her husband. As he watched, she began to walk the intricate path. She cried as she walked; he cried watching her. When they pulled themselves together, they explained to a concerned onlooker that they had come to Chartres to celebrate the end of the woman's treatment from breast cancer. They had never heard of a labyrinth before they walked into the cathedral that day. She could not explain why she was drawn to walk it, but when she did her husband decided to hold down the centre, giving thanks for her life while she made her way out of the labyrinth.

"I began to feel at peace with my body again after being very angry that it had let me down," the woman explained. As she walked, she found herself remembering all the people who had walked with her through her surgery and treatment. "I now know why we came." [From An Altar in the World by Barbara Brown Taylor.]

After all the fear and pain and anguish this couple experienced, they re-discover, as they walk the labyrinth, that God is the ultimate source of everything that is good and that that good will, eventually, rise up over evil and sin and death. The situation of the pandemic and its colossal impact on humanity, the unrest in Afghanistan, the natural disasters of flood and fire, racism, violence, etc. makes us feel that God is not present with us. Doubts creep into our minds causing much mental stress, depression, anger, anxieties etc. While it's hard to dismiss such feelings, we can almost certainly rediscover God in the service of the frontline workers, the vaccines, the support and healing extended to us by others. Let Jesus' "words of eternal life" be the light that illuminates our own daily "labyrinth" walk; may they be the wisdom that guides us on our journey — sometimes lonely and dangerous — to the dwelling place of God. Saint of the Day: St Rose of Lima Feast Day: 23 Aug

The first canonized saint of the New World has one characteristic of all



saints—the suffering of opposition—and another characteristic which is more for admiration than for imitation—excessive practice of mortification.

She was born to parents of Spanish descent in Lima, Peru, at a time when South America was in its first century of evangelization. She seems to have taken Catherine of Siena as a model, in spite of the objections and ridicule of parents and friends.

The saints have so great a love of God that what seems bizarre to us, and is indeed sometimes imprudent, is simply a logical carrying out of a conviction that anything that might endanger a loving relationship with God must be rooted out. So, because her beauty was so often admired, Rose used to rub her face with pepper to produce disfiguring blotches. Later, she wore a thick circlet of silver on her head, studded on the inside, like a crown of thorns.

When her parents fell into financial trouble, she worked in the garden all day and sewed at night. Ten years of struggle against her parents began when they tried to make Rose marry. They refused to let her enter a convent, and out of obedience she continued her life of penance and solitude at home as a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic. So deep was her desire to live the life of Christ that she spent most of her time at home in solitude.

- Enable priority access to family reunion to refugees from Afghanistán in Australia.
