



"A good shepherd has a positive influence on his people through "inward work", i.e., working on them from the inside." – Pastor Adelia Sunday

An elderly priest was upset with the things he was hearing during Saturday confessions. After his sermon one Sunday morning, he said to his congregation, "I'm tired of hearing so many people tell me in confession that they have cheated. For thirty years, people have been saying to me "I have cheated with Anthony... I have cheated with Mary... I have cheated with Frankie." I am sick and tired of hearing this word. From now on, when you come into my confessional, you will say "I have fallen with Anthony, or with Mary, or with Frankie." No more using the word CHEAT. It will be FALL."

About a year later, the old priest retired and was replaced by a younger man. No one thought to tell the new priest about the change of words in the confessional. After hearing his first round of Saturday confessions, the young priest went to the mayor of the town and said to him, "Mr. Mayor, you are going to have to do something about the deplorable condition of the streets and sidewalks in this town. Everybody is telling me they are falling all over the place." The mayor immediately understood the problem, and he leaned back in his chair and laughed. The priest was puzzled, and said, "Mr. Mayor, you shouldn't be laughing! Your wife told me that just last week she fell three times!"

Ever heard the expression "to know is to love"? When we're talking in a general way, it is certainly true that we can hardly be expected to fall in love with someone we don't know. But the statement "to know is to love" is not completely true when it is a question of human relationships. In these relationships, it is more accurate to say "to love is to know", i.e., that once we have decided to love others, to commit ourselves to other people, we open ourselves to them and they in turn, reciprocate by committing and opening themselves to us.

Jesus expresses this truth when he says: "Whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him." (Jn. 14:21) Francis de Sales echoes this truth by telling us, "Knowledge of the good can give us the beginning of love but not its measure." (Treatise, Book 6, chap. 4)

In today's Gospel, Jesus makes a surprising and startling revelation about his relationship with us. "I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me in the same way that the Father knows me and I know the Father." He is saying that he knows us as intimately and as personally as his heavenly Father knows him and we in turn know him the way he knows the Father. The kind of knowledge that Christ our Good Shepherd has for each one of us is only acquired by a very close and intimate contact with us. It is a result of his love for us, of his willingness to commit himself totally and completely to us, just as a shepherd totally and completely commits himself, his entire life to his sheep.

If we reflect on the relationship of a shepherd to his sheep, we see that his whole life is centred on the lives of his sheep. The shepherd is with them all day long, and many times throughout the night he watches over them. It's no surprise then that he gets to know all of the peculiarities, all of the individual traits of each of his sheep and gives them each a name. To others his sheep may all look the same, but to their shepherd, each is different and distinct. So, he has no trouble whatsoever picking his own out from among hundreds in the sheep pen.

The parable of the Good Shepherd is not so far removed from us as we might first be inclined to believe. It touches the very well-springs of our being - our need to be known and loved for who we are, no matter what. We might sometimes think, feel or act in ways that are as smelly and dirty as most sheep are; we might get into all kinds of

trouble by straying from our shepherd, like the sheep who get caught in bramble bushes, fall into rocky crags or have a hundred and one missteps. Nevertheless, our Good Shepherd is there to bind up our wounds. He knows and loves us to the extent that he puts his life on the line for us. Like the Good Shepherd, do we put ourselves on the line for one another even in simple ways? (Source duly acknowledged)



THE GOOD SHEPHERD

In the early Church, the figure of Christ as the Good Shepherd was a prominent image. This image is seen often in early Christian art. Clearly, it had great meaning for the early Christians since it often appeared, painted or sculpted, in the catacombs and on sarcophagi and baptismal fonts. Clearly, our ancestors in the Christian faith were moved by this image of Jesus. These effigies by the first generations of Christians show us that the image of Christ as the Good Shepherd was an image of faith that touched their hearts in a special way.


Already in the Old Testament, the figure of the shepherd was an image for God. The prophets Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel spoke of God as the shepherd of the people of Israel. The people were referred to as the Lord's flock. There is a particularly moving reflection on God as shepherd of His people in the famous Psalm 23 which begins: The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." In this beautiful psalm, the author writes that he lacks nothing as long as the shepherd is with him. He speaks of letting God, his shepherd, lead him to safe pastures: He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters; He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Cont...

Louis de Montfort

Feast Day: 27 April

Louis's life is inseparable



Rennes, France, as an adult Louis identified

himself by the place of his baptism instead of his family name, Grignion. After being educated by the Jesuits and the Sulpicians, he was ordained a diocesan priest in 1700. Soon he began preaching parish missions throughout western France. His years of ministering to the poor prompted him to travel and live very simply, sometimes getting him into trouble with Church authorities. In his preaching, which attracted thousands of people back to the faith, Father Louis recommended frequent, even daily, Holy Communion—not the custom then!—and

Louis founded the Missionaries of the Company of Mary, for priests and brothers, and the Daughters of Wisdom, who cared especially for the sick. His book True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin has become a classic explanation of Marian devotion.

imitation of the Virgin Mary's ongoing

acceptance of God's will for her life.

Louis died in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sèvre, where a basilica has been erected in his honor. He was canonized in 1947, and his liturgical feast is celebrated on April 28.


