Seat reservation for air travel or at the cinemas, sport stadiums and other entertainment places costs us extra. Those who are able to afford VIP or premier seats do so, maybe for their convenience or for many other reasons. In our gospel this Sunday, Jesus warns about this attitude of self-importance. Being a follower of Jesus is not about power, prestige, status or demanding the seat of honour in the community. In God's love, we are all created equal and He invites us to the table of the Lord as equals. In the four walls of the church, we are one family, sharing the same faith and the bread of life—the Body and Blood of Christ.

A minister was invited to preach one weekend at a large New York City church. The pastor offered him the use of his apartment for the weekend. He arrived on Saturday and settled in. He found a note on the refrigerator door: If you usually eat breakfast, you can go to the church, we have a breakfast for the homeless.

Early Sunday morning, the visiting preacher walked down the street to the church, in a dangerous part of New York, and stood in line with maybe two hundred people, waiting to be served. He struck up conversations with those waiting with him. "Well, what's put you in this situation?"

"Well," one man said, "it's alcohol. Might as well be honest with you, it's alcohol. But I'm dry now." Another said, "It was a woman. She took it all."

Several people shared their stories of illness, financial disaster, unemployment, divorce, broken relationships.

Then someone who did not know he was a minister asked him, "What put you here?" Not knowing what to answer, he said, "I was invited." Not wanting to create any distance, he sat with them for breakfast, ate what they ate, talked with them, and got to know them a little more before heading to the church.


Later that morning, dressed in his preaching robe, he stood in the pulpit of the beautiful church. As he listened to the magnificent choir and looked out at the congregation, he said to himself, who am I? I'm a guest, a guest of God, a guest of Christ, a guest of the church.

Being a follower of Jesus is about humility. This is not to be confused with weakness.

Humility speaks of an inner quality of recognising and appreciating who we are, the place of God in our lives and our relationship to other people. We are all privileged to sit at the table with Jesus as honoured guests. We learn a lesson of putting others first and serving them from the way that Jesus relates to us. In each celebration of the Eucharist, Jesus feeds us and nourishes us that we may be able to share the richness of God's life with the less fortunate and the neglected. God challenges us to have an honest assessment of ourselves without being proud, aggressive, and arrogant.

George Washington was riding near Washington city with a group of friends and they came to a place where they had to leap over a wall. In the process, one horse knocked off a number of the stones from the wall. Washington said, "We better replace them." His friends told, "Oh, let the farmer do it." But Washington didn't feel right about that. When the riding party was over, he went back the way they came. He found the wall and dismounted. Then he carefully replaced each of the stones. His riding companion saw what he did and said, "You're too big to do that." His only response was, "On the contrary, I am the right size."

This holy fire affirmed that God heard the cries of all who suffered, and promised to be with us as we followed in faith to our deliverance from injustice. **In this Season of Creation, this** symbol of God's Spirit calls us to listen to the voice of creation.

- $1. \quad \text{Building a clear ethical basis for the transformation we need to save biodiversity;} \\$

- 3. Promote global solidarity, taking into account that biodiversity is a global common good that requires a shared commitment;
- Put people in vulnerable situations at the centre, including those most affected by biodiversity loss, such as indigenous peoples, older people and youth.

St Gregory the Great

Feast Day: 3 September 2022

Gregory was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office he resigned,



founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate, and became a Benedictine monk in his own home at Rome. Ordained a priest, Gregory became one of the pope's seven deacons, and also served six years in the East as papal representative in Constantinople. He was recalled to become abbot, but at the age of 50 was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome. Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards and to care for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery. He is known for his reform of the liturgy, and for strengthening respect for doctrine. Whether he was largely responsible for the revision of "Gregorian" chant is disputed. Gregory lived in a time of perpetual strife with invading Lombards and difficult relations with the East. When Rome itself was under attack, he interviewed the Lombard king. Called "the Great," Gregory has been given a place with Augustine, Ambrose, and Jerome, as one of the four key doctors of the Western Church.
