

30th April 2023 4th Sunday of Easter

> Acts 2:14, 36-41 1 Pet 2:20-25 John 10:1-10

"For each one of us, there is only one thing necessary: to fulfil our own destiny, according to God's will, to be what God wants us to be." — Thomas Merton

Jokes about the priests and the church and the recent charges of abuse against a very tiny percentage of priests have shaped our views of priests and the institutional church itself. That is true only up to a point. We see another dimension to the life and work of priests and the number of good things done by the institutional church down the centuries and at present. This Sunday is observed as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. Today the church invites us to reflect on the meaning of God's call and to pray for a renewal of our commitment to the vocations we have already assumed and at the same time to pray for an increase in the Vocations to Priestly and Religious life.



The outstanding qualities of a Good Shepherd are well delineated in the gospel of this Sunday: knowing the sheep even by name, providing for them, keeping them together, and protecting them from any danger to the point of laying down his life for them. What is so striking is that a good shepherd is not intimidated by challenges but he is rather enhanced by them.

At the same time, the sheep have responsibilities of belonging to the shepherd and the rest of the fold and listening to his voice and following the shepherd. As the sheep of the fold of

Jesus, it would be proper for us to look at how we reflect the qualities of the Good Shepherd, i.e. our Jesus in our lives.

Our simple acts of care and love could possibly give us a leadership role. Whenever we show light to anyone in darkness, we are shepherds, whenever we put a smile on the face of someone, we are shepherds, whenever we give someone reason to live, we are shepherds. Whenever we preach the word of God by words or by actions, we are shepherds.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, the Church also asks us to pray for vocations. Because without people dedicated to their vocation – whatever it may be – so many people will never hear the Gospel, never hear the Shepherd's voice. We know that every person has a vocation. Every person is called on by God to do something specific with their life to bring salvation (fullness of life) to all.



Parents help to bring their children to salvation by raising them in the faith and in the Christian values. The children are expected to pay attention to their parents and also to obey them. In the recent guideline on marriage, Pope Francis instructed that children should be taught and learn to say: "Please", "thank you" and "sorry". Parents are expected to shepherd more by good examples than by those instructions that do not resonate with their lives. Spouses bring their husbands and wives to salvation by upholding their faith and living for each other in good times and in bad. Teachers help

bring students to salvation by educating them and helping them to develop their God-given talents. Students under various teachers should be open to learn and accept the formation they are given.


Business people bring others to salvation by living lives of integrity and witness to their faith by conducting business fairly and with justice and concern for the needy. The list goes on. Religious leaders at various levels are meant to lead the flock to God and not to the devil and evil; they are meant to tend the flock and not to tamper with them.

Every vocation, every authentic vocation, calls the disciple to do what God created them for, and helps God to bring salvation to the whole world. Bottom line, we should have great joy and satisfaction with the chosen vocation. Thirty-Eight years before I committed myself to the Voice of God and the mission entrusted to me... For the past 12 years, I have been a part of St Mad's community trying to do what God wants me to do. Nothing is easy and nothing is simple, but somehow, Jesus as the Good Shepherd, leads us and our community. Are you doing what God wants you to do with your life? Maybe

it means you renew your commitment to your family, your work, your life as a disciple. For young people it may mean to choose a career that pleases God and brings joy and satisfaction to them. May I request the young generation to set aside a few minutes everyday to commune with God and listen to Him and His plan for your life. (Sources duly acknowledged)

\$t Joseph the Worker

Feast Day: 1 May



To foster deep devotion to Saint Joseph among Catholics, and in response to the "May Day" celebrations for workers sponsored by Communists, Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gn 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labor. Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer. In his encyclical Laborem Exercens, Pope John Paul II stated: "the Church considers it her task always to call attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes so as to ensure authentic progress by man and society." Saint Joseph is held up as a model of such work.
