11th August 2019 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 18:6-9 Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19 Luke 12:32-48

The greatest legacy one can pass on to one's children and grandchildren is not money or other material things accumulated in one's life, but rather a legacy of character and faith - Billy Graham

The internet provides so much information that one can assume that the answer to every question is out there, somewhere. We just need to know where to look. Is that true? Or is it a fallacy? The answers to the most important questions, the fundamental questions of life, are not on the internet. They are not out there. The answers to the fundamental questions of life can only be found in faith. If we are honest, we will recognise that this is hard to handle. We would like to find the answers to everything. But we can't. Only faith can point us in the direction of the answers we need. More than that, only faith can provide us with the questions we need to ask. Faith forces us to ask about that which is unseen, that which is spiritual.

<u>Faith is the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen (2nd reading from Hebrews).</u> The perfect and the greatest example of faith is Abraham. Even in this mind-blowing or heart-wrenching situation, he was prepared to do what God had told him. He simply trusted God and His promises.

Faith demands a way of thinking that is completely opposite to the expectations of people of the computer age. We have to simply trust in God as we are unable to find answers ourselves for all the questions. When you got married, how sure were you that he/she is the right person for you or how sure were you that you were doing the

right thing? You took a leap of faith. You trusted in God and many of you are journeying together in spite of the setbacks or adversities of life.

We follow the instructions of the doctors when we become ill; taking medication, treatments etc. Still we realise that in the long run, our lives are in God's hands, not the doctor's. Live or die, we have faith that God will provide.

We are often beset with hardship and failure, pain and anguish, tragedy and disappointment; our dreams, hopes and plans are frequently unsuccessful. Abraham and many men and women of the history, and

even living around us, inspire us to hope in God's love and wait on God in patient trust. Life on earth is a journey in faith and a pilgrimage of hope. May we pray that God might give enough light for us to take the next step. (Adapted from Msgr. Joseph A. Pellegrino).

For further reflection:

Dorothy Day died in November 1980 at the age of 84. Reporting on her death, the New York Times called her the most influential person in the history of American Catholicism. Since her death, there has been a movement to canonize her for her personal life and her work among New York City's poor and destitute. In her book "From Union Square to Rome," she describes her conversion to Christ. One of her first attractions came in her childhood. One day she discovered the mother of one of her girlfriends kneeling in prayer. The sight of this kneeling woman moved her deeply. She never forgot it. In the same book she tells how, in the days before her



conversion, she often spent the entire night in a tavern. Then she would go to the early morning Mass at St. Joseph's Church on Sixth Avenue. What attracted her to St. Joseph's were the people kneeling in prayer. She writes: "I longed for their faith.... So I used to go in and kneel in a back pew." Eventually Dorothy Day received the gift of faith and entered the Church.





Historical Surprises with trusting Faith in God and readiness for action:

Who would have thought that relatively powerless persons could bring shifts in history? **Gandhi.** an unsuccessful lawyer, adapted the teachings of the Sermon on the Mount and the writings of Tolstoy and became the key to bringing independence to India, because he was ready.

Rosa Parks. in refusing to move to the back of the bus in Montgomery, sparked the beginning of the Civil Rights movement of the '50s and '60s. She was a rather inauspicious person to take such a critical action, but she was ready.

Nelson Mandela was sentenced to life in prison. He was released to bring a shift in the politics of South Africa at a critical juncture when many thought, either that change would never come or if it did, it would be accompanied by a vast bloodbath. The transition to a more just society came relatively peacefully under his leadership after he was unexpectedly released from prison. Prison had prepared him, made him ready.

Mother Teresa, a rather unpretentious nun, has been canonized a Saint for her simple act of trying to rescue people from the streets who might otherwise die. She was ready!
