Genesis 18:20-32 Colossians 2:12-14 Luke 11:1-13

Always have trust in God. Pray to Him and be patient. He will help us from sources which we never could have imagined.



The story is told of a Christian writing to the "Letters to the Editor section" of a newspaper. In his letter, he complained that it did not make sense for him anymore to go to the Church every Sunday. He explained: 'I've gone to Church for thirty years now and heard something like 3,000 sermons. But throughout my life, I can't remember any single one of them. So I think I'm wasting my time and the priests are wasting theirs too by giving one at all.'

"It became a controversial issue that went on for days and even weeks with many people reacting to agree or disagree with his opinion. But somebody wrote an enlightening response. It said: 'I have been married for thirty years now. In that time my wife cooked 32,000 meals. But throughout my life, I cannot recall what the menu was for a single one of those meals. But I do know this—they all nourished me and gave me the strength I needed to do my work. If my wife had not given me those meals, I would be dead today."

In the hustle and bustle of our busy lives, we can conveniently forget what is truly important to us in our daily lives. One of the many things can be prayer. How often we say, 'I don't have time to pray or go to the Church', or 'I will pray when I am not so busy or when I have time'. But, let us be honest, that time never really comes! We have to find time.

The gospel portrays the enthusiasm of the disciples to pray as they saw Jesus spending much time in prayer each day. They asked Jesus to teach them the modality of praying. In reply, Jesus gives them a model of prayer, which we all learnt as children. The recitation of this prayer has become so mechanical that we fail to realise the radicality and power of this prayer. The prayer that Jesus offers and teaches is not just words or a formula. Through this ancient prayer, Jesus shares with us the personal and intimate relationship that he enjoys with God, whom he calls 'Abba', which simply means 'dad'. Through this prayer we move closer to God and God comes nearer to us. The Lord's Prayer helps us to create and sustain an intimate and personal relationship with God. Through this prayer, we share our solidarity with the entire humanity and this prayer impels us to be concerned about one another by means of sharing and forgiving the wrongs of others and building up His Kingdom.



It is so easy to give up praying on the pretext that our prayers are not answered. Hard as it sounds, prayer is not about filing applications and getting what we want from God, or even changing God. It is the other way around. <u>Prayer is about letting God change and mould us over the course of our whole life.</u> The gospel reminds us that this takes patience and perseverance".

Someone said that "Prayer is an ongoing chatting of intimate communion with God. Through prayer, daily life takes on new meaning. It becomes a classroom of communion. In that classroom we learn the truth about who we are—and who we are becoming—in Jesus. Through prayer we receive new glasses through which we see the true landscape of life. Through prayer darkness is dispelled and the path of progress is illuminated. Through prayer we begin to understand why this communion seems so elusive at times; as we struggle with our own disordered appetites, and live in a manner at odds with the beauty and order of the creation within which we dwell only to find a new beginning whenever we confess our sin and return to our first love. Prayer opens us up to Revelation, expands our capacity to comprehend truth and equips us to change."

A woman was at work when she received a phone call that her small daughter was very sick with a fever. She left her work and stopped by the pharmacy to get some medication. She got back to her car and found that she had locked her keys in the car. She didn't know what to do, so she called home and told the baby sitter what had happened.

The baby sitter told her that the fever was getting worse. She said, "You might find a coat hanger and use that to open the door."

The woman looked around and found an old rusty coat hanger that had been left on the ground, possibly by someone else who at some time had locked their keys in their car. She looked at the hanger and said, "I don't know how to use this." She prayed to God and asked Him to send her help. Within five minutes a beat up old motorcycle pulled up, with a dirty, greasy, bearded man who was wearing



an old biker skull rag on his head. The woman thought, "This is what you sent to help me?" But, she was desperate, so.... she just kept quiet. The man got off of his cycle and asked if he could help. She said, "Yes, my daughter is very sick. I stopped to get her some medication and I locked my keys in my car. I must get home to her. Please, can you use this hanger to unlock my car?"

He said, "Sure." He walked over to the car, and in less than a minute the car was opened.

She thanked the man and through her tears she said, "Thank you so much! You are a very nice man."

The man replied, "Lady, I am not a nice man. I just got out of prison today. I was in prison for car theft and have only been out for about an hour." The woman thanked the man again and with sobbing tears cried out loud, "Oh, Thank you God! You even sent me a professional! "

Let prayer be a part and parcel of our life!


Last week at our women's breakfast we learnt about the organisation Days for Girls, as Monte gave packs to the girls in the Maliana school.




