16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Wis 12: 13, 16-19; Rom 8: 26-27; Mt 13: 24-43

"Learning about doctrine is easy; Jesus calls his people to learn to be his people"- Thomas Loughlin

Matthew's Gospel has been called the "Gospel of the Kingdom," containing some 51 references to the kingdom or reign of God. Three of Jesus' "kingdom" parables make up this Sunday's Gospel:

The magic words of the parable of the wheat and weeds were spoken by Jesus because of the criticism he and his disciples received from the Sadducees and the Pharisees. The Sadducees and Pharisees separated themselves from the tax collectors and sinners whom they saw as unclean and outside the saving power of God. But Jesus made a point of searching sinners out to teach them of God's love in the words he spoke and the miracles he performed. So the magic of the parable of the weeds and wheat rejects elitism; stresses the fact that the human community is a combination of both good and bad; that all judgment belongs to God; that judgment will take place only at the end of the world; and that there is ample opportunity for every person to change and grow. Evildoers can respond to God's offer of love and turn to goodness. Weeds can be transformed into wheat. What magic is greater than this?

The explanation of the parable that Jesus gives to his disciples after returning to the house does not come directly from Jesus. The words were spoken some eighty years after the resurrection of Jesus when members of Matthew's community were trying to prevent the community from splitting apart. Some members of the community believed that the community needed to be purified by tossing out the less than perfect Christians, while others believed that the church that follows Jesus should not play God.

Any separation of people must be left to God at the last judgment. The work of the Church is to preach repentance and practice patience and compassion and not condemn its members. (Dominican Centre: Spirituality for Mission) As Pope Francis says, "The Church, in this world, is more a hospital for sinners than a club for saints".

Through the magic words of the parables of the mustard seed and the leaven, Jesus

taught that even insignificant beginnings, a small seed, a little yeast, a group of twelve followers, can bring forth a new and better world. Our faith in the compassionate Lord gives us the ability to see the potential in the smallest of things and the courage and perseverance to unlock the potential. Humanity's dreams of peace, community and justice will be realized, first, in the everyday acts of such goodness of each one of us. God's reign is a powerful albeit unseen force. *Cont...*

A parable is told about Good and Evil. "One day, Good and Evil met upon the shore of the sea. They said to each other, "Let us disrobe and bathe in the sea." After they bathed in the sea for some time, Evil came to the shore and clothed itself with the garment of Good and walked away. Later Good too came out of the sea and found that its clothes had been taken away by Evil. Feeling ashamed to go naked, Good garmented itself with the clothes of Evil. To this day, both Good and Evil walk around in their disguised clothes. Only some who know the face of Good and Evil are able to identify their true

nature in spite of their garments. (Fr John Jose from Bangalore) To this day, both Good and Evil walk around wearing each other's clothing. Only those who have experienced God's patience and compassion are able to identify their true nature in spite of their garments. Let us pray to the Holy Spirit to give us the wisdom and patience needed to make good choices in this world where Good and Bad often come wearing

disguises (Sources duly acknowledged).




Sydney who is planning to move to Cailaco


