“PEOPLE WITH GOOD INTENTIONS MAKE PROMISES BUT PEOPLE WITH GOOD CHARACTER KEEP THEM”

There are many people in our midst who broadcast every good thing that they do. Their forum is public esteem and opinion. On the other hand, there are also people who do good deeds, but quietly, with no thought of public approval in mind. All they seek is to do God's will and to please Him. Which one am I? The one message that stands out in today's gospel is that God is delighted with the repentant sinners over the so-called righteous people who put a mask on themselves.

Some commentators have compared this passage in Matthew to the parable of the Prodigal Son in Luke; both stories revolve around two sons, and a choice, and change. It is clearly a theme that Jesus wanted to drive home again and again to his listeners, the notion that there is another way, a better way. The Father's way. The Father's will. He is calling.

I want to share a story I read in a commentary. *“Twenty-five years ago, a young man named Peter Day was embarking on a career as sportswriter in Australia. “Sports,” he once said, “was my religion.” He didn't pay much attention to his faith. “I had your standard boring Catholic upbringing,” he said, “and usually went to Mass just at Christmas and Easter.” As he was climbing up the career ladder, he got a job working for Australian radio. One Sunday, with nothing else to do, he wandered into a church. He found a seat near the back. Mass was underway. But it was unlike any he'd ever experienced before.*

It was a Mass for the homeless. All the people around him had no place to live, no place to call home. “I remember sitting there among all these poor homeless people,” he said, “And the gospel just came alive for me.” That moment was transformative. He knew he couldn't keep doing what he'd been doing. He'd found another religion besides sports. A year later, he entered the seminary.

During his formation, he asked the archbishop for a special assignment: he wanted to live and work among the homeless. The archbishop agreed. For eight months, Peter Day lived at the bottom of a stairwell with nothing but a mattress. He showered in a public toilet. He lived among the lonely, the fearful, the depressed, the mentally ill. When he was ordained a deacon, the ordination took place where he often volunteered: at a Matt Talbot centre for recovering alcoholics.

A few months after that, he was ordained a priest. Today, Fr. Peter Day runs a charity for the homeless in Australia. A guy who once seemed destined to have everything he wanted serves those who have nothing. He has never felt more fulfilled. “This is why I was ordained,” he says today, “to walk alongside those who are most vulnerable.” It's a far cry from what he was doing 25 years ago. But at a critical moment in his life, like the son in the gospel, Peter Day changed his mind. Now, working with the homeless, he is himself an agent of change. Changing lives. Changing circumstances. Changing minds” (source duly acknowledged).

God is summoning us, calling us, challenging us—just like the father did with the two sons. He is asking us to do his work in the world. Blessed Cardinal John Henry Newman put it beautifully: “God has created me to do Him some definite service,” he wrote. “He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another... I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good; I shall do His work.” Jesus in this story seems to accept that we will not always do good willingly. It takes time to build up good habits and ways of behaviour. He would prefer that we do good unwillingly than do nothing at all. This is called by someone as spiritual and human realism.

A story to reflect: A story is told about a businessman who was ordering 500 ballpoint pens from an office equipment salesman. The latter was writing the order in his notebook, when suddenly the buyer exclaimed: “Hold on! I'm cancelling the order.”

The salesman left the store wondering why the wholesaler suddenly changed his mind. “Why did you suddenly cancel that order of ballpoint pens?” asked the surprised bookkeeper. The businessman angrily answered, “Because he talked about ballpoint pens to me for half an hour, using every convincing argument and then he wrote out my order with a pencil! His practice did not agree with his profession.” A man's words must be followed out by actions. (*Justmehomely*)

Shopping List:

Cooking oil (vegetable/canola 750ml or 1 litre containers), Rice (Basmati is the most popular), Tinned chickpeas and kidney beans, Tinned diced tomatoes,

Breakfast cereal (Cornflakes are popular!) up to 500g packs, Condiments (honey, jam), Coffee (instant), Dried fruit (apricots, prunes, dates), Dried lentils (red or green)

Long life milk (1 litre containers), Noodles (instant)

Pasta (spaghetti, penne, spirals etc), Pasta sauce, Tea (black or green), Tinned or instant soup, Tinned corn

Tinned fish, Spices (chilli, curry powder, turmeric etc, small packets or bottles, Tinned fruit.

Other items: Deodorant (for men & women)

Shampoo, Nappies (for over 10kg babies only), Razors, Sanitary pads (no tampons), Shaving cream, Shower gel / body wash, Soap, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste.

Next Sunday, October 4th on the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the newest encyclical from the Vatican will be released called Fratelli tutti, on fraternity and social friendship. The Italian translation is "All Brothers", "Since it is a direct quotation from St Francis (taken from the Admonitions, 6, 1: FF 155), the Pope has obviously not changed it. But the formulation of the title in no way intends to exclude women, that is, more than half of the human race," wrote the editorial director for the Vatican Dicastery for Communication.

"On the contrary, Francis chose the words of the Saint of Assisi to initiate a reflection on something he cares about very deeply: namely, fraternity and social friendship. He therefore addresses all his sisters and brothers, all men and women who populate the earth: everyone, inclusively, and in no way exclusively."
