“GOD GIVES EVERYONE THE INGREDIENTS TO A GOOD, HAPPY LIFE. IT IS UP TO US TO MAKE THE MOST OUT OF THEM”

Every one of us wants to live our life to the full! Why then, many of us are easily disappointed? Could it be because we set ourselves impossible goals? Or is it because we neglect opportunities offered to us?

Two men went fishing. One was an experienced fisherman, the other wasn't. Every time the experienced fisherman caught a big fish, he put it in his ice chest to keep it fresh. Whenever the inexperienced fisherman caught a big fish, he threw it back. The experienced fisherman watched this go on all day and finally got tired of seeing the man waste good fish. "Why do you keep throwing back all the big fish you catch", he asked. The inexperienced fisherman replied, "I only have a small frying pan"



Sometimes, like that fisherman, we throw back the big plans, big dreams, big jobs, big opportunities that God gives us. Our faith is too small that we fail to walk confidently into what God brings our way.

Jesus is laying down a challenge in today's gospel reading. The religious leaders of the time, the Scribes and the Pharisees, had become obsessively cautious. Any change, any development, any alteration, anything new was anathema. Their approach had induced a religious paralysis which Christ was determined to challenge. For Christ, there is no place for the closed mind in religious thinking. His statement is that to each has been given different abilities which will contribute to the growth of the Kingdom - to one is given five, another two, and another one. Each one receives what the master thinks one is capable of working with. Although people are not equal in talent, it is expected that they will be equal in effort – The first two took it as an opportunity, an adventure to be explored. They knew that what the master had given them could easily be lost, stolen or invested badly... but they took the risk anyway. Their risk taking was well rewarded by the master. The third servant on the contrary took it as a burden, a potential landmine to be feared. He knew that what the master had given him could easily be lost, stolen, invested badly but he opted for damage control.

Of all the gifts or talents, Faith is a wonderful gift given to us. Any one who has faith and a love for doing good work, or to anyone who does good, God will give a blessing, in order to increase that person's faith or good works or both. Our faith as St James would put it in his letter, "Faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead." (James 2:17) This 'dead' faith will be taken away from that person. This faith which is just in name, or just something intellectual, or formal, will be taken away from him.

The message stands out clear: one should never become paralyzed by fear of failure and as a result take risks and launch out into the deep. Nothing ventured, nothing gained! Jesus himself is the example of a risk taker since he followed his convictions and left his home town to embark on a public mission that brought criticism and condemnation. Just remember the proverb: fortune favors the brave, which puts us on notice that we cannot wait for opportunities to come along, we need to create them happen. And we should make use of the opportunities God offers our way whether it is small or big. Our belief in the values of the goodness and love needs to be actively promoted. That was particularly pertinent to Matthew's world when the early Christians had to face opposition for their commitment to Christ, but it is no less true for Christians today in a world that is cynical of the values of Jesus Christ. *(Sources duly acknowledged)*



Saint Elizabeth of Hungary

Feast Day:
17 November

In her short life, Elizabeth manifested such great love for the poor and suffering that she has become the patroness of Catholic charities and of the Secular Franciscan Order. The daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth chose a life of penance and asceticism when a life of leisure and luxury could easily have been hers. This choice endeared her in the hearts of the common people throughout Europe.

At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing. Daily she would take bread to hundreds of the poorest in the land who came to her gate.

After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades, and Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her husband's family looked upon her as squandering the royal purse, and mistreated her, finally throwing her out of the palace. The return of her husband's allies from the Crusades resulted in her being reinstated, since her son was legal heir to the throne.

In 1228, Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order, spending the remaining few years of her life caring for the poor in a hospital which she founded in honor of Saint Francis of Assisi. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. Her great popularity resulted in her canonization four years later.
