Dear sisters and brothers,

We celebrate the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ this Sunday. Jesus creates with His Body and Blood a family, a community, a church brought together in the memory of Him. God's unconditional love is made human in Christ. "We come to the Eucharist to celebrate our identity as his disciples, to seek the sustaining grace to live the hard demands of such discipleship, to become his Church of justice, mercy and peace. At Christ's table, we always belong, we are always welcome. As I was tidying up my bookshelf, I came across the following which I had clipped years back from an article. But it still inspires us to think deeply as we partake of the table of the Lord and receive the precious and priceless gift of the Eucharist". Jesus wants us to be the Eucharistic people reflecting His love, sacrifice, communion and presence in our day today lives. "As we celebrate Jesus' great gift of the Eucharist, may we make our parish family's table a place of reconciliation and compassion — and may we work together to make all our family tables places of love and safety where Christ is present in our service to and care for one another".

- ❖ He was old, and sweaty; Pushing his homemade cart down the alley, stopping now and then to poke around in somebody's garbage. I wanted to tell him about EUCHARIST. But the look in his eyes, the despair in his face, the hopelessness of somebody else's life in his cart told me to forget it. So, I smiled, said 'hi' — and gave him EUCHARIST.
- ❖ She lived alone, her husband dead, her family gone, and she talked at you, not to you, words, endless words, spewed out. So, I listened — and gave her EUCHARIST.
- ❖ The city by night, lights change from red to green and back again, flashing blues, pinks and oranges. I gulped them in. Said "thank you God"- and made them EUCHARIST
- ❖ I laughed at myself, and told myself 'You with all your sin and selfishness, I forgive you, I accept you, I love you. It is good and necessary to give yourself a EUCHARIST.
- ❖ My God, when will we learn- you cannot talk- EUCHARIST? You cannot philosophize about it. YOU DO IT.
- ❖ You don't dogmatize EUCHARIST. Sometimes you laugh at it, sometimes you cry it, often you sing it. Sometimes its wild peace, the crying hurt, often humiliating, never deserved.
- ❖ You see EUCHARIST in another's eyes, give it in another's hand held tight, squeeze it in an embrace.
- ❖ You pause EUCHARIST in the middle of a busy day, speak it in another's ear, listen to it from a person who wants to talk.
- ❖ For EUCHARIST is as simple as being on time and as profound as sympathy. I give you my supper, I give you my sustenance, I give you my life, I give you me.
- ❖ I give you EUCHARIST. (Sources duly acknowledged)

Sometime ago I was in Washington, D.C. in the National Shrine. A dozen or so pilgrims came out of the grandiose basilica. They had participated in a Mass, they had received Holy Communion, forming with Him, his Body and Blood. I saw them, and I even saw a blind man who had received Communion with them. They came out of the Church together with him. He walked among them tapping the pavement in front of himself with his stick. He did not see them since he was blind but he must have been aware of them all talking excitedly, feeling a bit lost in a strange place. They did not see him, either, though they were not blind. He ended up in the midst of them. Someone stepped on his cane, bending it, while he was pushed on. They left him alone trying to straighten his cane. They had all been to Holy Communion together in Jesus, who said of all of them: "This is my Body, this is my Blood!" Yet, when it came to everyday life, that reality got lost, the Body did not seem to have been formed. They were not really in communion. They did not really form His Body, our Body. Did they? Do we? 
We are now exploring Thomas Merton's autobiography, Seven Storey Mountain, which looks at his spiritual pilgrimage.

St Barnabas Feast Day: 11 June



Barnabas, a Jew of Cyprus, comes as close as anyone outside the Twelve to being a full-fledged apostle. He was closely associated with Saint Paul—he introduced Paul to Peter and the other apostles—and served as a kind of mediator between the former persecutor and the still suspicious Jewish Christians.

When a Christian community developed at Antioch, Barnabas was sent as the official representative of the church of Jerusalem to incorporate them into the fold. He and Paul instructed in Antioch for a year, after which they took relief contributions to Jerusalem.

Later Paul and Barnabas, now clearly seen as charismatic leaders, were sent by Antioch officials to preach to the gentiles. Enormous success crowned their efforts. After a miracle at Lystra, the people wanted to offer sacrifice to them as gods—Barnabas being Zeus, and Paul, Hermes—but the two said, "We are of the same nature as you, human beings. We proclaim to you good news that you should turn from these idols to the living God" (see Acts 14:8-18).

But all was not peaceful. They were expelled from one town, they had to go to Jerusalem to clear up the ever-recurring controversy about circumcision, and even the best of friends can have differences. When Paul wanted to revisit the places they had evangelized, Barnabas wanted to take along his cousin John Mark, author of the Gospel, but Paul insisted that since Mark had deserted them once, he was not fit to take along now. The disagreement that followed was so sharp that Barnabas and Paul separated: Barnabas taking Mark to Cyprus, Paul taking Silas to Syria. Later they were reconciled—Paul, Barnabas and Mark. Cont...
