Zechariah 9: 9–10
Romans 8: 9, 11 –13
Matthew 11: 25–30

“Every time I thought I was being rejected from something good, I was actually being redirected to something better.” — Steve Maraboli.

Deep inside of us, we want people to like us and like being around us. Hence, some of us will do whatever it takes to make others happy. But this does not work in the long run. In being honest with ourselves, we have been in instances where we have not felt accepted for our genders; not felt accepted for our abilities; not felt accepted for our looks; not felt accepted for our choices; not felt affirmed; not felt encouraged; not felt guided and nurtured; not felt allowed to speak up; not felt physical affection; not felt protected and secure; not felt truly forgiven; not felt wanted or not felt validated as individuals. But, the readings of this Sunday remind us that the rejections in our lives does not mean rejection from God. In the first reading, Ezekiel is asked by God to go and preach to rebellious Israel. He was not accepted for what he had to say to them. God promised Ezekiel that ‘whether they listen or not, this tribe of rebels will know there is a prophet among them’. Paul, during his ministry, is afflicted with a ‘thorn in the flesh’. It is something that would diminish his Spirit but, the power of God assured him ‘my grace is sufficient for you’. In the Gospel we see Jesus coming to his own home town of Nazareth to preach to his people. Not only did the people refuse to accept Jesus, but they were offended by him, and refused to listen. He continued despite these rejections. He knew his purpose was great, and that God is there approving of what he is doing.

The painful memories of rejection in our lives should be resolved and healed. As a spiritual writer says, these wounds or unpleasant experiences when unresolved and unconfessed can lead us to develop fleshly impulse that are contrary to God’s will for us: “But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. (Galatians 5:16-17). God wants to heal all of the wounds that people have inflicted on our hearts over the years. He is nothing like the people who have hurt us. He is loving, kind, gentle, caring and perfect. What He desires is our freedom from bondage to pain we have suffered as a result of human rejection (in marital, family, community, parish or any relationships) and social abandonment. Can we surrender everything that is unpleasant to God in prayer? Can we see the wounds we have inflicted on others and reconcile with them with a repentant heart?

Human history tells us that a lot of great people experienced rejection. Great artists do not always get record label contracts the first time they try. Great literary works experienced a lot of rejections from publishers. Even great athletes experienced being cut from the team they are in. However, what made them great is that they kept trying and did not let rejection stop them. In following Christ, we do experience moments of trial, misunderstanding and rejection. We should not allow these rejections to intimidate us and belittle our self-worth and dignity. We know from our faith experiences that God never rejects us. We just need to hold on to his word that he has great plans for us, and continue doing what he asks of us. Eventually, as we surrender to Him, we will be rewarded and all those rejections will not matter. (Ideas from various sources duly acknowledged)

Two paupers wandered from town to town, begging for alms. One was a giant who had never been sick in his life; the other was a cripple who had never known anything but sickness. The giant used to laugh at the cripple. At last, the two paupers reached the capital city. They arrived just at the time when a great misfortune had taken place. Two of the kings' most trusted servants had died suddenly. One was his personal bodyguard, the strongest man in the land; the other was his personal physician, the most skilful in the entire realm. So, the king sent his courtiers into his kingdom to gather all the strong men and doctors who wished to apply for the vacant posts. The king finally chose one strong man and one doctor from among all the applicants. He then asked them to furnish proof of their fitness for the posts. "Your majesty", said the strongman, "Bring me the strongest and biggest man in the city and I will kill him with one blow of my fist." The doctor said "Your majesty, bring me the most helpless cripple you can find and I will make him well in a week." The king sent his courtiers to bring the strongest man and the weakest cripple they could find. They soon came upon the two paupers and brought them before the king. With one blow of his fist the strong man killed the giant. Then the doctor examined the cripple and after a week's treatment he made him well. The strength of the strong often proves to be their downfall, while the weakness of the weak often saves them. (Floor McCarthy, in 'New Sunday & Holy Day Liturgies)





Saint Maria Goretti

Feast Day:
06 July



One of the largest crowds ever assembled for a canonization—250,000—symbolized the reaction of millions touched by the simple story of Maria Goretti. She was the daughter of a poor Italian tenant farmer, had no chance to go to school, never learned to read or write. When Maria made her First Communion not long before her death, she was one of the larger and somewhat backward members of the class. On a hot afternoon in July, Maria was sitting at the top of the stairs of her house, mending a shirt. She was not quite 12 years old, but physically mature. A cart stopped outside, and a neighbor, 18-year-old Alessandro, ran up the stairs. He seized her and pulled her into a bedroom. She struggled and tried to call for help. "No, God does not wish it," she cried out. "It is a sin. You would go to hell for it." Alessandro began striking at her blindly with a long dagger. Maria was taken to a hospital. Her last hours were marked by the usual simple compassion of the good—concern about where her mother would sleep, forgiveness of her murderer (she had been in fear of him, but did not say anything lest she cause trouble to his family), and her devout welcoming of Viaticum, her last Holy Communion. She died about 24 hours after the attack. Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison. For a long time he was unrepentant and surly. *-Con't-*
