'God calls you to the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet'- Frederick Buechner

Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's readings speak of two major concepts related to our lives as Catholic Christians. The first is "called or chosen" and the other is "sent." In other words, we are called to be 'disciples' (followers) and 'apostles' (sent on a mission) of Christ. In the first reading, Amos is called to speak in God's name. Jesus sends forth the twelve apostles to preach the good news and to bring healing to the sick and hope to the downtrodden. St. Paul tells us that we are chosen and sent forth to proclaim the Good News and make the Kingdom of God real in our midst. Not only are we chosen, we are also blessed. Take a minute to count the blessings you have! We are fortunate to be here in Australia and to live in this community. We are blessed to be with our family and friends. We have been blessed with religious freedom though we feel stifled at times. We have been blessed with rich, religious traditions. We have been blessed to live in a wonderful, caring, supportive environment. We have been blessed with clean water, education for our children, medical facilities and many other incentives in this part of the globe. No matter how difficult our circumstances may be at times, we would probably rather be here than in many other countries. Just think of the plight of Australian citizens stranded outside of our country at present who are desperate to come back to their homeland. Don't you think that we are chosen by God and He has blessed us magnificently in unimaginable ways?

In the analogy of Henry Nouwen, "since we are God's adopted children- just as the bread, which becomes the body of Christ, is taken, blessed, broken and given at each liturgical celebration so we as the beloved and chosen, are blessed, broken and given. Just as Amos, and the apostles were chosen and instructed to go out to proclaim the gospel, to heal and cure the sick (physical, relational, mental and spiritual), we too are chosen to live our lives for God. Our mission is to open the minds and hearts of the people starting with our own family, to appreciate the blessings God has given us which are taken for granted quite often. The future generation should be taught to clearly see their blessings so that they may appreciate what they are blessed with. It is in this trajectory of life, we are chosen and sent forth.

God is calling us to help others, even if it is just a kind word, or recognizing them through greetings with due respect and dignity. Wherever help is needed, we are to step forward and do our share. Jesus did this in his public life and so also his followers in history. So too must we fulfill our call to the service of God and his people.

We understand that God's call - to Amos, to Paul, to the Twelve - and now to us- was not and is not always easy. As always, the call of God has social implications and a special relevance to us in our historical situation. In the given situation of lockdown in NSW, we are urged to adhere to the guidelines given by the medical and political officials to contain the transmission of the vicious virus among the communities. We do it for the love of God and the love of our country! I believe this is one of the ways of responding to the call of being a disciple of Jesus in the given context of the pandemic. The pandemic has exposed the harsh realities of the extreme polarity between the haves and have-nots, the ingrained racism in many parts of the world, and the greediness of the wealthy, powerful, affluent etc... and as God's people we are called to drive these forces away from the face of the earth as they are opposed to the Spirit of God. Easier said than done! We have to take this challenge and bring about a change even at the micro level.


When the apostles were not welcome, they were told to shake the dust off their feet and move forward. Jesus admonished them to 'let go' of the rejections and to dust off their feet with love and not with anger and hopelessness. Oftentimes, we are taunted and discouraged by our friends and family members in our effort to fulfill our baptismal call. But we should persevere in handling all the obstacles we encounter in our missionary journey. Our faith in God summons us to be caring and responsible for the wellbeing of everyone.

The mayor of a certain town decided to hold a harvest festival. All, without exception, were invited. The mayor himself offered to provide the food. To ensure that there would be adequate wine, each guest was asked to bring along a bottle of white wine. The wine would be poured into a huge cask from which all could drink. The day of the festival arrived. Everyone in town showed up. Thanks to the generosity of the mayor, there was an abundance of food. Each guest duly arrived with a bottle of wine and poured it into the cask. When all was ready the mayor went to the cask. An aide tapped it and filled the mayor's glass. Holding up the glass, the mayor said, 'I declare the festival open.' Then he took a drink out of the glass only to discover that it was not wine but water. It seems that each guest had argued like this: 'My contribution won't be missed.' So instead of bringing a bottle of wine they had brought a bottle of water. The festival was ruined! It is a great challenge to us all to be active, not passive followers of Christ; to be not only receivers but also givers. Something is asked of every person. And everybody's contribution, no matter how small, is important. For the forest to be green, the individual trees must be green. (Sources are duly acknowledged)

Pope Francis reminds us that in the face of so many challenges God "... calls us to generous commitment and to give him our all."

Let us heed to the invitation of God in the given context of our lives!







Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Feast Day: 16 July

Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah



in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. By the 13th century they became known as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel."

They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary. In 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary. Their great saints and theologians have promoted devotion to her and often championed the mystery of her Immaculate Conception. Saint Teresa of Avila called Carmel "the Order of the Virgin." Saint John of the Cross credited Mary with saving him from drowning as a child, leading him to Carmel, and helping him escape from prison. Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus believed that Mary cured her from illness. On her First Communion day, Thérèse dedicated her life to Mary. During the last days of her life she frequently spoke of Mary. There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary's own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way.
