The key to Christian living is a thirst and hunger for God. And one of the main reasons people do not understand or experience the sovereignty of grace and the way it works through the awakening of sovereign joy is that their hunger and thirst for God is so small - John Piper

Once there was a young Hindu hermit who lived as an ascetic in a forest. He owned nothing except a pair of loincloths. One morning, to his great disappointment, he found that mice had destroyed one of his loincloths. He brought a cat to kill the mice, and then, a cow to give milk to the cat. Later, as the cows multiplied, he hired a girl from the nearby village to look after the cows and to sell the extra milk in the village. Eventually, his growing worldly desire prompted him to end his religious life, marry the girl and settle down as a farmer in the village. This little story illustrates how the never-ceasing hunger for worldly desires can easily side-track us.

As human beings, we hunger for many things besides food and material possessions. We hunger for recognition, true friendship, truth, faith, hope, love, appreciation, encouragement and so on. But only God can satisfy our various forms of hunger, particularly our spiritual hunger. St. Augustine said: "O Lord, you have made us for Yourself, and our hearts are restless 'till they rest in You."

Have you ever had an experience of being hungry despite eating and gorging yourself with delicious food? Have you experienced emptiness despite being surrounded with all the luxuries of life? It is in these moments that we realize that there is more to life than eating and drinking, and having all that money can buy.

"At the age of 40, Tom Phillips was the president of the largest company in the United States of America. He had plenty of sophisticated cars, a beautiful home, a lovely family. But Tom Phillips was not happy. In fact, he was downright unhappy. Something was missing from his life; he didn't know what it was. There was this inner emptiness he experienced. Then one night during a business trip to New York, something happened to him. Tom Phillips had a religious experience that changed him for ever. Speaking of that experience he said: "I saw what was missing from my life." It was Jesus Christ. "I hadn't ever ... turned my life over to him." And that night Tom did just that. And that night Tom's life changed in a way that brought him happiness he never dreamed existed. - Mark Link in 'Sunday Homilies'

I think, sometimes we must be stripped of our usual sources of support in order to be reminded that our ultimate sustenance comes from God alone, and we have to humbly acknowledge our total dependence on God. Won't you agree that this horrific pandemic makes us think about what is essential and what counts most in life? Are we really concerned about the safety and wellbeing of one another, especially the vulnerable? We are hungry for freedom from the clutches of lock down... but do we also recognize the hunger of people who are lonely, isolated, abused or victims of the ruthless behaviour of a few? If we truly believe that Jesus is the bread of life and He quenches our thirst and hunger by giving himself to us in the Eucharist, and in every single gesture of love, and grace in our lives, then we are obligated to see the hunger and thirst of the people around us and offer Jesus, the bread of life, in our reaching out to them.

Recalling the gospel of last Sunday, Jesus moved with compassion and he fed thousands of people with the five barley loaves and two fish. The joyous crowds now search for Jesus (but for wrong reasons) and track him down. Jesus confronts them and tells them that they are after a miracle worker who would make all hunger disappear. Further, from his teaching to the crowds, we understand that Jesus does not want us to settle for junk food; he affirms that life does not have quick fixes; "Instant" religious gratification, the 'perishable food' of the gospel quotation, doesn't last. "Instant religion" is no religion at all. It is a fleeting 'high'. It is so easy for us humans to want "instant everything", especially in a modern culture that suggests that technology can produce it. Supermarkets have shelves screaming out "instant ice-tea "Quick Quaker Oats," "one-minute muffins". Drive-in restaurants assure us that our orders will be ready in the time it takes to drive to the serving window. Banks boast that all our bills for months can be paid in a one, three-minute smart app. Jesus does not promise us instant religion. The "food that remains unto eternal life," the very presence of Jesus himself, does not suddenly turn us into perfect saints, into deliriously joyful religionists who are never depressed. Rather, Jesus comes to us constantly to partake of the experience of true religion; effort-filled prayer, the tedious struggle to serve humanity, the disciplined commitment to gospel values. – edited Eugene Lauer

We need this bread... for every day! When Jesus fills our hearts and minds, our spirits can be hopeful even in the face of failure, sickness and hurt. The promise is food for the soul that will never leave us hungry no matter what life throws our way!

May we constantly hunger for what truly nourishes us!

Saint John Vianney

Feast Day: 04 Aug



A man with vision overcomes obstacles and performs deeds that seem impossible.

John Vianney was a man with vision: He wanted to become a priest. But he had to overcome his meager formal schooling, which inadequately prepared him for seminary studies. His failure to comprehend Latin lectures forced him to discontinue. But his vision of being a priest urged him to seek private tutoring. After a lengthy battle with the books, John was ordained. Situations calling for "impossible" deeds followed him everywhere. As pastor of the parish at Ars, John encountered people who were indifferent and quite comfortable with their style of living. His vision led him through severe fasts and short nights of sleep. With Catherine Lassagne and Benedicta Lardet, he established La Providence, a home for girls. Only a man of vision could have such trust that God would provide for the spiritual and material needs of all those who came to make La Providence their home. His work as a confessor is John Vianney's most remarkable accomplishment. In the winter months he was to spend 11 to 12 hours daily reconciling people with God. In the summer months this time was increased to 16 hours. Unless a man was dedicated to his vision of a priestly vocation, he could not have endured this giving of self day after day. Many people look forward to retirement and taking it easy, doing the things they always wanted to do but never had the time. But John Vianney had no thoughts of retirement -*con't-*
