Spiritual identity means we are not what we do or what people say about us. And we are not what we have. We are the beloved daughters and sons of God ~ Henri Nouwen

We all have to answer crucial questions in life. When we're young, our grandmother asks, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" and we can say "a doctor", "an engineer", "a sports person", "a soccer player", "a fireman" etc. without following through. But, in time, the question "What will you do with your life?" requires a mature, thoughtful answer. Today, there are so many questions regarding Covid and the vaccination which each one has to answer sincerely from one's own heart in solidarity with the vulnerable and afflicted. In great faith and love of God, one has to make a choice that will enhance the wellbeing of the entire community and the world at large.

That famous question, "Who do you say that I am?" occurs in this Sunday's Gospel. It can be a very important discernment question because how we answer it affects everything. If you say Jesus was a good man who set a good example, that may be nice, but it doesn't necessarily call a person to any radical change. If you say Jesus is the one who will judge us in the end, then it might just make you anxious and act out of guilt. If you say Jesus is the creator of the universe manifesting in human form to teach us how to live and love, you might feel more drawn to respond with your life.

At a very personal level, we probably answer this question differently from others, and even for ourselves at different points in our lives. Because Jesus is also a 'person,' we are in a relationship, and relationships change over time. Jesus may not change, but our understanding of him and way of relating to him will. Some of the different answers I have had to this question: Jesus you are... my partner... my hope... a carer... a challenger... the one I take time with each night and morning... the core relationship in my life.

Discernment involves other people. But the strongest voice in becoming who I am, and discerning what I am called to do, is the voice of Jesus. It challenges us to examine ourselves, 'who we really are, and who we portray ourselves to be'. Do not forget, there's the "you" in you who others see but you don't; there's the "you" in you who both you and every other person sees; and there's the "you" in you who only yourself sees and knows. To me, this last one is the most important because that is who you really are. And so, today's message is an opportunity to take stock, and decide like the prophet Isaiah in the first reading (Is 50:5-9a), to yield to God at all times.

In our mobile, individualistic, therapeutic, technologically-driven culture "we develop our concept of self by watching how other people react to different versions of ourselves that we present" (Charles Horton Cooley). Our self-esteem and identity mainly come from what outside eyes see in us and what outside voices say about us. We are made "in God's image" and we are made to reflect Him. In our increasingly secular society, God, faith and service to others no longer serve as a means of identity. Our relationships have thinned out and our identities are more fragile. We are driven by 'image consciousness' and we do everything to keep our image without counting the cost. We allow others to determine who we are for us. Today's gospel invites us to walk with our God in deep relationship with Him and His people which gives us the true picture of who we are and helps us to live our Christian life even with the little we have and the little we can contribute, remembering that 'faith without good works is dead' (James 2:26). It is this identity that helps us in our difficult times and especially during this pandemic to submit ourselves patiently to God and wait for this Covid storm to pass.

Do not forget, the question is, before God and men, "who are you?" and who I am enables me to answer who Jesus is for me? (Excerpted from Sister Lorraine and Fr Uchendu Simeon)

**Saint of the Day : Our Lady of Sorrows
Feast Day: 15 September**



For a while there were two feasts in honor of the Sorrowful Mother: one going back to the 15th century, the other to the 17th century. For a while both were celebrated by the universal Church: one on the Friday before Palm Sunday, the other in September.

The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple.

Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment.

Saint Ambrose in particular sees Mary as a sorrowful yet powerful figure at the cross. Mary stood fearlessly at the cross while others fled. Mary looked on her Son's wounds with pity, but saw in them the salvation of the world. As Jesus hung on the cross, Mary did not fear to be killed, but offered herself to her persecutors.
