Isaiah 53:10-11

Hebrews 4:14-16

Mark 10:35-45

"I don't know what your destiny will be, but one thing I know: the only ones among you who will be really happy are those who have sought and found a way to serve." *Albert Schweitzer*

In a world of stars and stripes, titles, and accolades, we have been told what matters is not where you sit, but how you serve. Not what you know but how much you impart; not what you teach, but how much you tithe (give). The greatest among us are not those who exercise power over others, but those who serve others. The parameter of greatness according to Jesus is humble service to the needy and vulnerable. Greatness is not to be measured by achievements, medals won, accomplishments, power, status, wealth, influence etc. but it is to be measured by one's readiness to be at the service of others without expecting anything in return. Serving others is not a bed of roses, it may incur suffering and hardships and one must be 'ready to drink the cup'. I would like to share a few excerpts at random from various articles for our reflection this Sunday.

- The breakfast you make early in the morning so the children and your spouse can go to work or school is a more sacred and admirable mission than that of the missionaries who go out into other lands.
- Your example, your practice of faith and your presence is as much a witness and missionary activity as the preaching of the gospel to the gentiles.
- The daily cup of sacrifice and hardship, thankless chores, patient endurance, silent tears and unspoken grief are all part of the price of being a disciple.
- A crisis can be viewed as a challenge or a predicament but a crisis can also be seen as an 'opportunity' for many positive things in life. The pandemic has given us an opportunity to identify who is in our community and to explore what their needs are. How can we serve them? In other words, how can we become a better church? The pandemic has taught us that we really need other people. We find a new respect for each other in that. We see that people have various needs, once we realize this, we can then see that even we can do our part. Jesus was right. "The son of man has come to serve, not to be served". (Mark 10:45)
- Mother Teresa of Kolkata was once summoned to court on a trumped-up charge that she was converting children in her care to the catholic faith. Standing before the judge, she was asked if that was true. Turning to one of her sisters, who was cradling a little baby in her arms, Mother Teresa asked for the infant. Then turning to the judge, she replied: "Your honour, I picked this little baby from the garbage bin. I don't know the religion of the family into which this innocent infant was born, nor do I know the language that its parents speak. All that I do is that I give this child my love, my time, my care, my food and the best thing that I have in my life - my faith in Christ Jesus. Can't I give this child the best that I have in life?" The case was dismissed in favour of Mother Teresa.
- It may sound unbelievable, but it is true that Asia's first Nobel Prize winner in Literature (1913), Rabindranath Tagore, was behind the three great national anthems of three great nations, viz. Bangladesh, India and Sri Lanka. He was also the first non-westerner to win the Nobel Prize in literature. He did so in 1913. He wrote this short poem: I slept and dreamt that life was Joy; Then I awoke and realized that life was Service. And then I went to work - and, lo and behold, I discovered that Service is Joy.
- St. Vincent de Paul explained the costly grace of the Christian vocation when he told his followers: "Let us work with a new love in service of the poor, looking for the most destitute and abandoned among them. Let us recognize that before God they are our Lords and masters, and we are unworthy to render them our small services."
- Lutheran pastor and theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer's writings might help us focus on Isaiah's Servant Song and today's Gospel. While in a Nazi prison, Bonhoeffer reflected that all people turn to God for help when they are "sore bestead." On the other hand, he said that those who have been captivated by Christ turn to God when God is "sore bestead." Bonhoeffer believed that Christians stand by God in God's hour of grieving: when God is poor, scorned, homeless and hungry, "whelmed under weight of the wicked."

While we recognize many servants in the spectrum of life, the largest sector of the economy comprised of those involved in cooking, cleaning, washing, caring for the elderly and disabled and many other areas goes unrecognized. The COVID-19 pandemic has shown us that even if markets collapse, the care economy continues to function; that the care economy is perhaps the most fundamental and important part of the economy. And with growing elderly populations in most countries, the importance of the care economy will only increase. The importance of care work must be recognized, drudgery and danger in some care work reduced, responsibilities redistributed between men and women as well as between households and the State. More care work should be remunerated, and care workers should be represented through collective bargaining and in policy debates about care work. (David Kane, Mary Knoll reflections)

Let our focus not be on our own advancement or position, but on the needs and concerns of others. Whether we're at home or in the workplace, at church or in the community, we will seek to be Jesus's disciples who serve others in humility and love. Let us be great in the sight of God by 'drinking the cup' in the love and service of our fellow sisters and brothers!

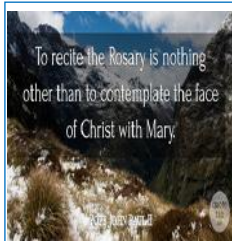
ST MADS BOOK CLUB

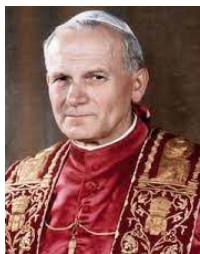


Saint of the Day : Saint John Paul II

Feast Day : October 22

"Open wide the doors to Christ," urged John Paul II during the homily at the Mass where he was installed as pope in 1978.

Born in Wadowice, Poland, Karol Jozef Wojtyla had lost his mother, father, and older brother before his 21st birthday. Karol's promising academic career at Krakow's Jagiellonian University was cut short by the outbreak of World War II. While working in a quarry and a chemical factory, he enrolled in an "underground" seminary in Kraków. Ordained in 1946, he was immediately sent to Rome where he earned a doctorate in theology.



Back in Poland, a short assignment as assistant pastor in a rural parish preceded his very fruitful chaplaincy for university students. Soon Fr. Wojtyla earned a doctorate in philosophy and began teaching that subject at Poland's University of Lublin.

Communist officials allowed Wojtyla to be appointed auxiliary bishop of Kraków in 1958, considering him a relatively harmless intellectual. They could not have been more wrong! Bishop Wojtyla attended all four sessions of Vatican II and contributed especially to its *Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*. Appointed as archbishop of Kraków in 1964, he was named a cardinal three years later. Elected pope in October 1978 - con't-
