Dear sisters and Brothers,

The scenario of people begging In front of churches, temples, and shopping centres are phenomenal in Asian developing and underdeveloped countries.

The story is told that one day outside the shops, there was a mother nursing a baby. She was very thin and dressed in rags. She had only a few coins in her plate. On the other side, was a young girl leading a blind woman. People seemed attracted to her young voice and smile and she had much more in her mug of coins. It was near evening time. The girl walked to the woman with the baby and she poured all her coins in the woman's plate saying: "You did not have much luck today; this will help you."

Generosity is the central theme of today's readings. In the first reading, the prophet asks the widow to share in her nothingness. She shared the little she had, relying on the words of the prophet. In the gospel, another widow comes to the Temple with her offering, not knowing someone is watching her. This someone is Jesus who is touched by what he sees her do. The first widow was asked by Elijah to give what she had. This one, without being requested, gives ALL. What an amazing trust she had in God's providential care! These women today speak the same message: it is a call to us to be generous. What is challenging is their total trust and dependence on God having been neglected by society. God is the source of help and hope.

As you hear the word generosity, some of you may be counting what you give for the churches, to beggars, perhaps to some charitable organisation. This is important, but it is not all that we can do, generosity is not only about money. It is all about your love, time, understanding, service, listening, encouraging, appreciating, complimenting etc. Some people are difficult to love but still, we are commanded to act lovingly towards others in the same way that God acts towards us.

There are three kinds of givers.... Grudge givers, duty givers, and love givers. Grudge givers give but do it grudgingly or reluctantly... half-heartedly, duty givers give with a sense of obligation. Love givers give because they want to... they do it freely and joyfully motivated by love or compassion... What kind of giver are you?

In the prevailing culture of 'accumulating', we are invited to create a counter culture of 'giving'... The so-called 'have-nots' of today around the impoverished nations (like the widows in the first reading and the gospel) are the real challengers... God has given us all... to give and to share....

In the context of our faith community today... I greatly appreciate the volunteers of various ministries of St. Madeleine's such as the sacramental co-coordinators, collaborators and the group leaders, Vinnies, ministers on the altar, cleaners musicians, singers, readers, Eucharistic ministers, formators of Faith programs, care group, social justice group, junior altar servers, catechists, collectors, welcomers, florists, parish council, finance committee, junior youth group coordinators, children's liturgy facilitators and so on ...in giving their time and God-experience for the integrated development of our community. Each member of our congregation has something to give and often we have much more to give than we might at first realise. We would all like to be viewed as generous. Let our parish community set itself as a challenger in living out the "ever Living ... Giving, & Loving God'. (Source of thoughts duly acknowledged)

Frances Xavier Cabrini was the first United States citizen to be canonized. Her deep trust in the loving care of her God gave her the strength to be a valiant woman doing the work of Christ.

Refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher, she began charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy. In September 1877, she made her vows there and took the religious habit. When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named Frances prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. Seven young women from the orphanage joined her. Since her early childhood in Italy, Frances had wanted to be a missionary in China but, at the urging of Pope Leo XIII, Frances went west instead of east. She traveled with six sisters to New York City to work with the thousands of Italian immigrants living there. She found disappointment and difficulties with every step. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. The archbishop advised her to return to Italy. But Frances, truly a valiant woman, departed from the archbishop's residence all the more determined to establish that orphanage. And she did.

In 35 years, Frances Xavier Cabrini founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated and the sick. Seeing great need among Italian immigrants who were losing their faith, she organized schools and adult education classes.. - *con't-*
