

# 9th January 2022 Baptism of Lord

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7 Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

# We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ. -- Pope Francis

A Black Man's Tribute to His White Mother is author James McBride's best-selling memoir of growing up in a family of twelve brothers and sisters, raised by a white Jewish mother who was evasive about her Jewish ethnicity but steadfast in her love for her children.

As a boy in Brooklyn's Red Hook projects, James knew his "light skinned" mother Ruth was different—and wondered if he was black or white. When he asked her mother one day if he was black or white, she snapped "You're a human being. Educate yourself or you'll be a nobody!" For Ruth, education, not race or culture, was the realization of one's full identity.

But young James wasn't satisfied. So, he asked his mother, a very religious woman, whether God is black or white.

Mother Ruth sighed, "Oh boy . . . God's not black. He's not white. He's a spirit." "Does he like black or white people better?' "He loves all people. He's a spirit." "What's a spirit?" "A spirit's a spirit." "What colour is God's spirit?" "It doesn't have a colour," his mother said. "God is the colour of water. Water doesn't have a colour."

James writes that he "could buy that" and, as he got older, continued to appreciate more deeply and profoundly the many dimensions of his racial and cultural identity. On this feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we see in the clear, life-sustaining waters of our own baptisms the "colour" of our identity as the "beloved" of God, the God who loves us, who cries with us and for us, who knows the pain and despair and anger we experience because he has experienced it all himself by becoming one of us. In the waters of baptism, we embrace the Spirit of God and that Spirit embraces us, as well: God the Creator and Father is present to us in all our tears and laughter, in all our struggles and triumphs, in our every grief and joy. In the waters of baptism, we attain the identity of God's children.



In the baptism of Jesus, His sonship was publicly proclaimed by a heavenly voice: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22). The fondness of Christ's relationship with God is revealed as pleasing and delightful just as that of believers (Rom. 1:7, 1 John 4:10).

The reception of the Holy Spirit and divine anointing prepare Jesus for the ministry of justice (Luke 4:18). He dedicates his life to serving humanity, restoring the poor to a place of honour and dignity, rehabilitating those on the fringes of social life and relationship, and freedom for those whose experience of self-flourishing is controlled or denied in a social system that is designed to keep them out. Jesus reveals to us what happens to a believer who is anointed at baptism and receives the gift of the Holy Spirit. Just as Christ acknowledges that he must get on with doing the work of God (John 9:4), likewise our baptism prepares us to get involved and to share in the work of God for the salvation of the

world. We are called for the ministry of justice in the world as the prophet Isaiah said in the first reading (Isa. 42:3). Through our baptism in Christ and our relationship with God we become people of justice. Our experience of the reception of the Spirit of God prepares us for service in the saving plan of God for the world.

In Gaudete et Exultate (On the Call to Holiness in Today's World), Pope Francis reminds us that our union with Christ "entails reproducing in our own lives various aspects of Jesus' earthly life: his life in community, his closeness to the outcast, his poverty and other ways in which he showed his self-sacrificing love." Our lives of baptismal initiation in Christ invite us to uphold the dignity of every child of God, to express goodwill toward everyone—especially the poor and vulnerable—and to consciously care for creation.

To each one of us and to those whose baptismal initiation we witness, Pope Francis reminds us that our "identification with Christ and [the will of Christ] involves a commitment to build with him that kingdom of love, justice, and universal peace." Our baptism in Christ, therefore, invites us to uphold the life of each one in a dignified world. (Source: A Sampler Connections and Reflection from US Catholic)

There is a story told of the machinist who worked years ago at the original Ford Motor Company plant in Detroit, Michigan. Over a period of years he had "borrowed" from the factory various car parts and tools which he hadn't bothered to return. While the management never condoned this practice, nothing was ever done about it.

In time, however, the "forgetful" machinist experienced a Christian conversion and was baptized. More importantly, the man took his baptism very seriously and became a devout believer. The very morning after his baptism, the machinist arrived at work with his pickup truck loaded with all the parts and tools he had taken from the Ford Company over the years. He went to his foreman and explained that he never really meant to steal them and asked to be forgiven.

The foreman was so astonished and impressed by this act that he cabled Henry Ford himself, contacting the auto magnate while he was away visiting a European Ford plant. In his telegram the foreman described the entire event in great detail. Ford immediately cabled back this striking two-line response: "Dam up the Detroit River. Baptize the entire Plant!"

#### **SOCIAL JUSTICE @ ST MADS**

A small number of Australian communities continue to experience entrenched and persistent disadvantage, the Dropping off the Edge 2021 report from Jesuit Social Services was recently re-



leased <a href="https://www.dote.org.au/full-report">www.dote.org.au/full-report</a> Dropping off the Edge 2021 shows us that people in communities with high levels of public housing likely experience concurrent issues such as long-term unemployment, family violence and contact with the criminal justice system – demonstrating a complicated picture of multiple disadvantage. To understand and address disadvantage it is essential to engage with and listen to community members. Community members stressed the

need for good community infrastructure, clear communication and coordination of resources.

# Saint : Hilary of Poitier Feast Day: 13 January

This staunch defender of the divinity of Christ was a gentle and courteous man, devoted to writing



some of the greatest theology on the Trinity, and was like his Master in being labeled a "disturber of the peace." In a very troubled period in the Church, his holiness was lived out in both scholarship and controversy. He was bishop of Poitiers in France. Raised a pagan, he was converted to Christianity when he met his God of nature in the Scriptures. His wife was still living when he was chosen, against his will, to be the bishop of Poitiers in France. He was soon taken up with battling what became the scourge of the fourth century, Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ.

The heresy spread rapidly. Saint Jerome said "The world groaned and marveled to find that it was Arian." When Emperor Constantius ordered all the bishops of the West to sign a condemnation of Athanasius, the great defender of the faith in the East, Hilary refused and was banished from France to far off Phrygia. Eventually he was called the "Athanasius of the West." While writing in exile, he was invited by some semi-Arians (hoping for reconciliation) to a council the emperor called to counteract the Council of Nicea./ cont.
