Palm Sunday recalls an event in the Christian Scripture (The New Testament) of Jesus entering into Jerusalem and being greeted by the people waving palm branches. For Christians, it is a reminder of the welcoming of Jesus into our hearts and of our willingness to follow him.

followed by Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ, when he established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion. It also commemorates His institution of the priesthood. The Last Supper was the final meal Jesus shared with his Disciples in Jerusalem.

Good Friday

15 April 2022 10am Stations of the Cross 3pm The Passion of our Lord

Good Friday, the Friday before Easter, the day on which Christians annually observe the commemoration of the Crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

Holy Saturday

16 April 2022 Easter Vigil 5.30pm Mass

Holy Saturday, also called Easter Vigil, Christian religious observance that ends the Lenten season, falling on the day before Easter Sunday. It is a beautiful celebration when we renew our baptismal promises and rejuvenate our faith in the living God.

17 April 2022 Sunday 8am and 10am Mass

Easter is the victory of Jesus over death and it gives us hope in the midst of difficulties and uncertainties of life.
