

Each one of us can make a difference. Together we make change

A pastor tells the story of a worried mother who phoned the church office in the afternoon before the annual Christmas program to say that her small son, who was to play the role of Joseph in the Christmas Pageant, had a cold and had gone to bed on doctor's orders. "It's too late now to get another Joseph," the director of the play said. "We'll just have to write him out of the script." And they did! Joseph just disappeared! And only a few of those who watched that night realized that Joseph was missing. Joseph is often forgotten. But today's gospel is centered on Joseph.



Joseph probably had a sense of where his life was headed and what his hopes and dreams were for Mary, his intended wife. In no time, all his dreams were crushed down as he found out the pregnancy of Mary. He might have found himself at the edge of his life. He was petrified, confused, and depressed. But he did not extinguish the light of faith burning inside of him. In a dream, the angel cleared his doubts and asked him to take Mary as his wife.

Now, at first glance, it might seem that Joseph's life is put back in order. He knows what he is to do; he can simply move on and be the foster father of Jesus and husband of Mary. More than that, he had no clue of what the new life entailed as to his personal relationship with Mary and his God's son.

Joseph would find that his life was not simply interrupted by this change; his life was forever changed. It became a life that had to be rooted in faith, not just a general faith in God, but a faith that would always accept that God would be there to assist him, to help him. Never would he be a complete master of his own life as we often like to picture us to be in our own lives.

While what happened to Joseph in its specifics –being called to be the guardian of the Messiah –is clearly not part of our experience, most of us find at some point in life that our plans for life are drastically changed. It might be through the loss of a job, sickness, financial misfortune, divorce, or an unplanned pregnancy, trouble with children, or death that turns our world upside down, and it usually doesn't seem to have anything holy about it.

This is precisely where this story of Joseph and the life he lived from this point on can guide us. We can look at the events which involuntarily change our lives as gross interruptions that must be reversed, refused. We can address them with stoicism, and not grumble about them but quietly have the attitude that life has ripped us off. Or we can look at these events and ask "Where is God in all of this? What might be God calling me to do with this situation so that it becomes an opportunity for Him to act through me?"

Might the situation call us to re-examine our values, to re-prioritize what is really important in life? Might the event be a wake-up call to become more attuned to what it means to be a Christian person? Might the event be calling us outside of ourselves to be a person for others?


There was a woman who lived down the street. On the day she and her husband signed the papers for their house, he went home and had a major nervous breakdown; after that point he was delusional and interpersonally non-responsive. Five months later she gave birth to a child with severe mental disabilities. How did she react? She kept them both at home, because she thought they needed her love more than what an institution could give them, and she eventually would take in a mentally handicapped adult who had no place to stay. She saw in her situation that she was called to make a difference in a way she hadn't planned. My family and others as well, saw her as a light in the darkness, and we learned from our interaction with her and her husband and daughter the dignity of people who were different from us.

No one of us is called simply to exist in this world as some neutral force that will not affect the world around us. (It is impossible to do that. By our very existence, we take up space, consume resources, and affect others whether we want to or not.)

The question then is, "What difference will I make in the world? Will I use not just my time, talents, and treasures to make God's presence known, but will I also use the events of my life to achieve that end?" A simple carpenter from Nazareth did, and it made all the difference in the world- Modified and excerpted from Jeffrey M. Kemper

St Peter Canisius

21 December



Peter was one of the most important figures in the Catholic Reformation in Germany. He played such a key role that he has often been called the "second apostle of Germany," in that his life parallels the earlier work of Boniface. Although Peter once accused himself of idleness in his youth, he could not have been idle too long, for at the age of 19 he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards he met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced Peter so much that he joined the recently formed Society of Jesus. After his ordination in 1546, he became widely known for his editions of the writings of St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great. Besides this reflective literary bent, Peter had a zeal for the apostolate. He could often be found visiting the sick or imprisoned, even when his assigned duties in other areas were more than enough to keep most people fully occupied. In 1547, Peter attended several sessions of the Council of Trent, whose decrees he was later assigned to implement. After a brief teaching assignment at the Jesuit college at

Messina, Peter was entrusted with the mission to Germany—from that point on his life's work. He taught in several universities and was instrumental in establishing many colleges and seminaries. He wrote a catechism that explained the Catholic faith in a way that common people could understand—a great need of that age. Renowned as a popular preacher, Peter packed churches with those eager to hear his eloquent proclamation of the gospel. He had great diplomatic ability, often serving as a reconciler between disputing factions. In his letters—filling eight volumes—one finds words of wisdom and counsel to people in all walks of life. At times he wrote unprecedented letters of criticism to leaders of the Church—yet always in the context of a loving, sympathetic concern. At 70, Peter suffered a paralytic seizure, but he continued to preach and write with the aid of a secretary, until his death in his hometown of Nijmegen, Netherlands, on December 21, 1597.
