*Our prayers for Cardinal Pell who has reached sweet home in God’s time. In his tribute to the late Cardinal, Pope Francis has said that he was “a grateful soul” and “committed witness to the gospel and church” who also laid the foundations for changes now under way at the holy see’s secretariat for the economy, which Pell led between 2014 and 2019 with “determination and wisdom”. He bore witness to Christ even when he was subjected to public disgrace and imprisoned for a year or so. Even in the prison, he was able to bring the light of Christ to the fellow inmates. Such a tenacious faith he had all through his life. May we pray that he may rest in peace!*

Every one of us, young and old, have stories to tell others; stories of joy, achievements, accomplishments, winning trophies or love, betrayal, loss, pain etc. John the Baptist in today’s gospel invites us to bear testimony to the spiritual peaks of our life such as miraculous escape from accidents, cure from terminal illness, freedom from guilt feelings through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the experience of the presence of Jesus during the turbulent moments of life etc. Today’s Gospel is a personal and corporate call to become a witness to Jesus, the Lamb of God.

According to Merriam-Webster online Dictionary, the definition of the word, “TESTIFY” is: to make a statement based on personal knowledge or belief, to serve as evidence or proof; to express a personal conviction; to make a solemn declaration under oath; to make known; to give evidence; to bear witness” To put it in a nutshell, to bear witness is to speak of what we know, what we have experienced.

The first Christians had a hard life; they were materially poor; they lived as an oppressed people; they lived under the colony of the Roman Empire and they had to endure harsh realities of life. Yet, they found the Spirit, a Light, a goodness that fired them up. They experienced an ineffable joy amid their persecutions and predicaments of life. They could not stop telling the story of Jesus as they found themselves coming to life in the presence of Jesus. They kept bearing witness to Jesus passing on the joy they had found. The life of many men and women in the history of the Church makes us think of our witnessing life.



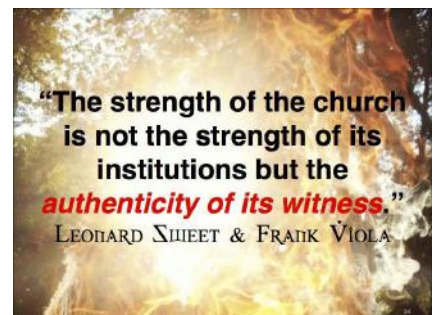
Recently, I visited a young mother who has been diagnosed with malignant cancer. Contrary to my imagination, she was smiling, lively, and delightful. She is very strong in her faith and she confidently believes that Jesus will never let her down. In my talk with the five young kids, I understood that they were totally upset on hearing the plight of their mother, yet, they are very supportive of their mum in all the possible ways. How well they testify to their faith even amid their suffering. My meeting with the family was really a challenge to me personally. Sure, many of us could instantly share the sentiments and the conviction of this family when it comes to our relationship with God especially at the crossroads of our life.

“For many of us faith has always been something to be expressed in church on Sundays, not on the rest of the week at Schools, Sports clubs, market places and working places. And even if we wanted to testify, what on earth could we say about our messy lives, our doubts, and our mistakes? Who would listen? What if we opened our mouths and looked like fools? What if we did more harm than good? What if people laughed or even worse ignored us? What if we just aren’t important enough, or faithful enough, or nice enough for our stories to matter?”



But today’s passages urge us to take a chance—to remove the shades from our lamps and fill our mouths with a new song. Like it or not, if we are people of faith, we are witnesses to the truth—a witness that someone else may desperately need to hear. Maybe our life testimonies, as ordinary as they seem to us, are truly heroic. Maybe they are the stuff of legends, sharp and bright, worthy to be told and retold, whether anyone is really listening, or not. Today’s gospel reminds us that on this journey, there is no room to hide; no time for silence; no place for false modesty. What we have been given, we must, in turn, proclaim” (Source -Susan Fleming McGurgan).

## St Anthony of Egypt

### Feast Day:

17 January 2023



The life of Anthony will remind many people of Saint Francis of Assisi. At 20, Anthony was so moved by the Gospel message, "Go, sell what you have, and give to [the] poor" (Mark 10:21b), that he actually did just that with his large inheritance. He is different from Francis in that most of Anthony's life was spent in solitude. He saw the world completely covered with snares, and gave the Church and the world the witness of solitary asceticism, great personal mortification and prayer. But no saint is antisocial, and Anthony drew many people to himself for spiritual healing and guidance. At 54, he responded to many requests and founded a sort of monastery of scattered cells. Again, like Francis, he had great fear of "stately buildings and well-laden tables." At 60, he hoped to be a martyr in the renewed Roman persecution of 311, fearlessly exposing himself to danger while giving moral and material support to those in prison. At 88, he was fighting the Arian heresy, that massive trauma from which it took the Church centuries to recover. "The mule kicking over the altar" denied the divinity of Christ. Anthony is associated in art with a T-shaped cross, a pig and a book. The pig and the cross are symbols of his valiant warfare with the devil—the cross his constant means of power over evil spirits, the pig a symbol of the devil himself. The book recalls his preference for "the book of nature" over the printed word. Anthony died in solitude at age 105.
