The story is told about a seminarian who was serving as a tour guide at St Peter's, Vatican. One time he was leading a group of Japanese tourists who knew nothing of our faith. With particular care he explained the great masterpieces of art, sculpture and architecture. He finally concluded at the Blessed Sacrament Chapel trying his best to explain quickly what it was. As the group dispersed, an elderly man, who had been particularly attentive stayed behind, and said, "Pardon me. Would you explain again this 'Blessed Sacrament?" Our student did, after which the man exclaimed, "Ah, if this is so, what is in this chapel is a greater work of art than anything else in this basilica." Today's feast of Corpus Christi is intended to make us value and appreciate the worth of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. [Msgr. Timothy M Dolan in Priests of the Third Millennium, (2000), p. 226.]


The Feast of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Sunday) commemorates the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It was first initiated by St. Juliana of Cornillon. St. Juliana received a vision in which she was told that this feast honouring the Body and Blood of Christ was missing in the liturgical calendar and should be added. She was much opposed by some from her own religious order and suffered at their treatment. However, she shared her vision with, and received support from, the future Pope Urban IV, who upon becoming Pope sanctioned this feast in 1264. Later Pope Clement V mandated that this feast should be observed throughout the Catholic world.

The Second Vatican Council states that the Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian Life' (LG 11). The Sacrament of the Eucharist is very central to our catholic faith. It is the source from which we gain spiritual strength and vitality and the summit of saving faith as we remember and receive Jesus who suffered for the entire humanity. The Eucharist strengthens our sense of unity and love. The sharing of the same bread and the same cup brings the faithful together in Jesus. This feast reminds us that as we receive Jesus's Body and Blood in the Eucharist that he made the ultimate sacrifice for us, and it should elicit from us not only a willing dependence on him but an invitation to Jesus to abide in us, providing true life. Pope Francis has said that the Eucharist should create a communion that the world needs today. At every Mass, Pope Francis states that this "miracle is repeated: in the hearing of the word and in the sign of the broken bread, even the smallest and lowliest assembly of believers becomes the body of the Lord, his tabernacle in the world."

As we receive the Body and Blood of Christ in faith, may we also realise deeply that we are the Body of Christ in, and for, the world today.

The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Feast Day: 16 June

The Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is a reminder that our human

feelings, desires and inclinations—our hearts—must be inclined to God's providential love for each and every one of us. The opening prayer for today's liturgy expresses how the heart of Jesus is a symbol of "the wonders of his love for us" and reminds us "of the overflowing measure of grace" that comes to us through Christ. In the history of Israel, the symbol of the human heart stands for the very core of the human person. The daily prayer prescribed in the book of Deuteronomy 6:5-6: "Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your strength. Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today." The prophets speak of how God will remove the "stony heart of sinners" and give them a new living heart. When asked what was the greatest commandment (Mt 22:36-39), Jesus quoted Deuteronomy 6:5 and joined it to the injunction of Leviticus 19:18: "Love your neighbor as yourself." This teaching of Jesus is the heart of his teaching. Christian history bears witness to how devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus appears to have offered a remedy to the harsh spirituality of the Jansenist period of the middle 17th century. The teachings of this movement so emphasized human sin and depravity that fear of hell and damnation lurked in the hearts of many Catholics, making some people scrupulous and leaving most people fearful of damnation. St. John Eudes (1602-1680) and St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-90) played key roles in promoting devotion to the Sacred Heart. The celebration of the Feast of the Sacred Heart is a

great reminder of the love of God for each of us. "
