17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kgs 3: 5, 7-12 Rom 8: 28-30 Mt 13: 44-52

"Jesus said to the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field which someone has found; he hides it again, goes off happy, sells everything he owns and buys the field.

'Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls; when he finds one of great value he goes and sells everything he owns and buys it." - Matt 13:44-46

If you found treasure buried in a field, what would you do? Most people would dig it up, sell it and become rich. But that's not what happens in today's gospel. Instead, we find a strange response. Rather than taking the treasure, the person hides it, sells everything they own and buys the field.

The parable poses a riddle. Why would someone buy the land, instead of just taking the treasure? The answer lies in the kind of treasure that is found in the field. The treasure that Jesus talks about isn't gold or diamonds. It's the kingdom of heaven.

Heaven is a treasure that cannot be stolen. It cannot just be dug up and taken, like one might do with a buried chest of doubloons. In order to obtain the kingdom of heaven, you have to first give everything. Jesus thus flips the concept of finding treasure on it's head. True treasure is found in the giving, not in the taking.

There's a couple of other interesting insights this parable poses to us. Notice that the treasure in the parable is hidden. The kingdom of heaven is like this - it's something waiting to be found, something to be sought out. And unlike trying to find treasure by looking at a map, we find the treasure of heaven by looking to Jesus.

After all, heaven is a relational reality. It's about being in communion with God, and at the heart of communion is love. This is why true treasure is found by looking to Jesus. In this way, we become spiritually rich. When we pour our hearts to Jesus, as Jesus pours out his heart to us, this sacrificial power of love unites us together in a mystical way for eternity.

We see again, as we read the parable of the pearl, this theme of giving everything up for the kingdom. Jesus calls us to be foolish to a worldly way of thinking, a calling to a radical way of life where nothing else matters except one thing - the pearl of heaven.

I wish you all a very happy week. May you find the kingdom of heaven in your lives, the treasure and pearl of an ongoing and transformational relationship with the heart of Jesus.


#### \$aint Ignatius of Loyola

Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty,
my memory, my understanding,
and my entire will,
All I have and call my own.
You have given all to me.
To you, Lord, I return it.
Everything is yours; do with it what you will.
Give me only your love and your grace,
that is enough for me ~ St Ignatius

The founder of the Jesuits was on his way to military fame and fortune when a cannon ball shattered his leg. Because there were no books of romance on hand during his convalescence, Ignatius whiled away the time reading a life of Christ and lives of the saints. His conscience was deeply touched, and a long, painful turning to Christ began. In 1534, at the age of 43, he and six others—one of whom was Saint Francis Xaviervowed to live in poverty and chastity and to go to the Holy Land. Four years later Ignatius made the association permanent. The new Society of Jesus was approved by Pope Paul III, and Ignatius was elected to serve as the first general. Ignatius was a true mystic. His spirituality is expressed in the Jesuit motto, Ad majorem Dei gloriam—"for the greater glory of God." In his concept, obedience was to be the prominent virtue, to assure the effectiveness and mobility of his men. All activity was to be guided by a true love of the Church and unconditional obedience to the Holy Father, for which reason all professed members took a fourth vow to go wherever the pope should send them for the salvation of souls. http://www.franciscanmedia.org

Women over 55 are experiencing homelessness at alarming rates. Right now, in Australia, we're experiencing a range of crises: the escalating cost of living, a shortage in affordable housing, gender inequality which negatively impacts women's superannuation savings, and a rise in elder abuse. For many older women who are relying on their pension as their only income, they're at a severe disadvantage when competing against double income earners in the rental market.

Elder abuse is also becoming more common. Many older people become homeless after their relationship with their adult child goes downhill. Sadly, this is likely to happen easily, when an adult child is the main carer for their elderly parent.
