

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

How are you? Family? Hope everything goes well at your end with the grace and love of God. The Spring has sprung already bringing more sunshine into our lives. Let us also spring forth into a 'shining life' with the grace of God.

Our Bishop Vincent Long has appointed me as the Chaplain for the Tamil Community in the diocese of Parramatta. This does not mean relinquishing my ministry in our parish but it is an added ministry which I hope to carry out with your support and prayer.

Many of us thought that covid would have taught us a lot about our personal and social lives. Mainly, I believed that it taught us 'how fragile we are without a healthy collaboration of humankind' underscoring the significance of mutual understanding and the caring of each other. I expected that this disaster would deepen the sense of God, in the minds and hearts of people, compelling them to be humane in their dealing with one another. Contrary to our expectations, misunderstanding, anger, disunity, unforgiveness, war, violence, wrong ideologies and perspectives, greediness and selfishness are eating up human society starting with families. The readings of this Sunday present us with a practical scenario that requires the incarnation of love as it affects the relationship we have with other people.



In the first reading, God tells Ezekiel that he is to be a Watchman for the house of Israel. He is obliged to warn Israel of moral dangers. This reading challenges us to look beyond our own happiness and embrace a deeper sense of responsibility for one another. If our focus remains solely on our own interests, we miss the core message. In the gospel, Jesus teaches that a true Christian, not only assists his neighbour in temporal and spiritual needs with material help and prayer, but also with correction and counsel for an erring brother or sister who has damaged the community by his or her public sin in a broader understanding of the term. In the second reading, St Paul points out that the love we have for one another should be our only reason for admonishing the wrong or evil doers.

We are called to assist those in need: the defenceless, the abused, the refugees, the neglected and the 'little ones' in society. "Equally significant is our obligation to confront whatever is contrary to the Gospel. Silence in the face of wrongdoing implicates us in it, both individually and as a community. This duty to voice our dissent applies not only to personal interactions but also to our engagement

with broader societal and communal issues" (US young Catholics). We are to take a stand against the false ideologies and perspectives perpetuated today by the media or a small group and establish a just, humane society. "As followers of Jesus, we need to cultivate a culture of accountability, where the pursuit of justice and righteousness prevails" (US young Catholics).

As we reflect on these readings this weekend, let us affirm the responsibility and authority we have been entrusted with through baptism by God. As a Christian, we are all God's 'minor prophets', 'watchmen' for God's creation. By being guardians of each other, we can assure a beautiful life for each and everyone. We can't join the club of Cain in the OT questioning, "Am I my brother's keeper?" The need of the time is prayer, dialogue and action.

A story to reflect and even discuss with the family members:

This is a story about four people named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody, and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was asked to do it. Everybody was sure Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it. Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody's job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it but Nobody realized that Everybody would not do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done. (Unknown author)

Exaltation of the Holy Cross

Feast Day: 14 September



Early in the fourth century, Saint Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in search of the holy places of Christ's life. She razed the second-century Temple of Aphrodite, which tradition held was built over the Savior's tomb, and her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot. During the excavation, workers found three crosses. Legend has it that the one on which Jesus died was identified when its touch healed a dying woman. The cross immediately became an object of veneration. At a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem toward the end of the fourth century, according to an eyewitness, the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered placed above Jesus' head: Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on." To this day, the Eastern Churches, Catholic and Orthodox alike. celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the September anniversary of the basilica's dedication. The feast entered the Western calendar in the seventh century after Emperor Heraclius recovered the cross from the Persians, who had carried it off in 614, 15 years earlier. According to the story, the emperor intended to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward until he took off his imperial garb and became a barefoot pilgrim. www.franciscanmedia.org
