
Is 55:6-9 Phil 1:20-24, 27 Mt 20:1-16

The Kingdom of God is not a matter of getting individuals to heaven, but of transforming the life on earth into the harmony of heaven. - Walter Rauschenbusch

The first principle of psychology is that each one of us sees life from one's own perspective. The capacity to look at life from our own individual perspective plays out in countless ways.

How many times have we looked at a couple and mused: "What does she see in him?" or "in her?" How often have we criticised another person's taste or style? There are countless examples in this first principle of psychology. We see things from our own perspective. From a counselling perspective what matters is not the facts of any situation but the point of view of the person trying to deal with those facts. While this first principle of psychology is unquestionably true, it can become a trap. For if our perspective becomes the only point of view with which we gaze upon the world...when we believe that what we see, what we experience and what we feel are the only legitimate perspectives, then we can become trapped in a mire of selfishness. This is the heart of today's Gospel. It is well captured in the words of the Prophet Isaiah "God's thoughts are not our thoughts".

The gospel tells the story of an owner hiring labourers at five different times of the day. When the time for the payment comes, he pays the same wage to everyone. From the perspective of the persons hired at 9 am, it is unfair. Looking from legal terms the owner's act cannot be justified. But whose point is it? The master gave them exactly what was agreed upon. The persons hired early might have felt that they were cheated. They should have received more. In Jesus' time Judaism had reached a legalistic state, and the mentality was prevalent that salvation could and must be earned. There were many commands which must be fulfilled, and people were divided into two classes, the righteous who were on the road to salvation by fulfilling the commands, and the unrighteous, outcasts despised by those who kept the law. It was this slot-machine conception of God that Jesus opposed by his emphasis on love, for in love there is no calculation of duties, rights and obligations; there is only an open-handed giving without counting the cost, and a grateful receiving. The gospel parable would seem strange as an economic model where money is the bottom line but is better understood in a system where mutual love and caring is the guiding principle which is quite evident in our family relationships.



The point of this Gospel story is that God acts in the way that God wants to. God isn't dependent on our perspective of what is owed to us and what is just. Rather God's point of view is one of generous love and total compassion. That's the key...God loves each one of us. God doesn't treat us by our standards. We are treated by God's standard...God's point of view. Can you imagine what it would be like if we could make God's point of view our own? (Thanks to the sources)

Pope Francis says: "The Church must be a place of mercy freely given, where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel." (EG §114)

"There was a guy who died and was being given a tour of heaven, and he saw a friend of his drive by in a beautiful Mercedes. He said, "Boy, this is great! "Oh, yes," St. Peter said, "your friend was really generous on earth; we had a lot to work with.

Your transportation up here depends on your generosity down there." Then St. Peter gave him his transportation: a Honda motor scooter. He said, "Wait a minute, he

gets a Mercedes, and I get a scooter? "That's right, it's all we had to work with." So the guy drove off in a huff. A week later Peter saw this guy all smiles and said, "You feeling better now?" The guy said, "Yea, I have ever since I saw my preacher go by on a skateboard! "A life of generosity reflects God's nature in a special way. Surely, God is just; but He is also outrageously generous and merciful at the same time. We do not get what we deserve. Rather God gives us more than we deserve. Today, He calls each one of us to be generous people".

Saint Vincent de Paul Feast Day: 27 September



The deathbed confession of a dying servant opened Vincent de Paul's eyes to the crying spiritual needs of the peasantry of France. This seems to have been a crucial moment in the life of the man from a small farm in Gascony. France, who had become a priest with little more ambition than to have a comfortable life. The Countess de Gondi-whose servant he had helped—persuaded her husband to endow and support a group of able and zealous missionaries who would work among poor tenant farmers and country people in general. Vincent was too humble to accept leadership at first, but after working for some time in Paris among imprisoned galley slaves, he returned to be the leader of what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the Vincentians. These priests, with vows of poverty, chastity, obedience, and stability, were to devote themselves entirely to the people in smaller towns and villages. Later, Vincent established confraternities of charity for the spiritual and physical relief of the poor and sick of each parish. From these, with the help of Saint Louise de Marillac. came the Daughters of Charity, "whose convent is the sickroom, whose chapel is the parish church, whose cloister is the streets of the city." He organized the rich women of Paris to collect funds for his missionary projects, founded several hospitals, collected relief funds for the victims of war, and ransomed over 1,200 galley slaves from North Africa. Pope Leo XIII made him the patron of all charitable societies. Outstanding among these, of course, is the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, founded in 1833 by his admirer Blessed Frédéric
