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# 3rd September 2023 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jeremiah 20:7-9 Rom 12:1-2 Mt 16:21-27

There's something fascinating about Peter. One of my favourite passages in the New Testament is the prologue of the Gospel of John, where Peter jumps out of the boat when he sees the Risen Christ on the shore line. He throws off his garment and dives right in, swimming with all of his strength. It's such a Peter thing to do, wearing his heart on his sleeve.

We see in Peter moments of great passion but we also see moments of great weakness. It's a bit like the Gospel today. We read in one moment Jesus calling Peter the 'rock,' and in the next moment Jesus calls him a 'stumbling block.' I love the exchange that takes place between the two of them. Jesus and Peter are completely open to each other.

While we see both passion and weakness in Peter, we also see something redemptive. We know that, while he will at first abandon Jesus and run away from the cross, he will eventually ask for forgiveness, and embrace his own cross. The Gospel today is a bit of a prelude to all of this happening. Today we get a glimpse into Peter's thinking about the prospect of Jesus going to his death. He is determined not to let that come to pass.

But Peter misses the whole point of Jesus' crucifixion. Jesus makes it clear - on the third day, he will be raised up from death. This was going to take a lot of faith to believe. It's not every day we see someone resurrected. Peter just wasn't ready yet to accept what Jesus is saying. What Jesus was saying didn't fit with his idea of a messiah.

Jesus' rebuke of Peter holds nothing back. "Get behind me, Satan!" he says.

It takes a little bit of unpacking to understand this response. The cross, while a gruesome fate, was also the means of salvation. It is in the death on the cross, the perfect sacrifice of love, that God overcomes the grip that death holds over humanity. This is why then Jesus rebukes Peter - he is unknowingly getting in the way of the pathway to human redemption.

On a lighter note, I wish all of the fathers here a very happy Father's Day, and also a big thank you to everyone who helped out on Friday night for the memorial mass for Fr Vincent's mother. The outpouring of support and love was quite evident, so thank you all for what was a special night here in the parish. May Arockia Mary rest in God's heavenly arms.

#### Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary



Feast Day: 8 September

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8 Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation, and asks for an increase of peace.

Reflection We can see every human birth as a call for new hope in the world. The love of two human beings has ioined with God in his creative work. The loving parents have shown hope in a world filled with travail. The new child has the potential to be a channel of God's love and peace to the world. This is all true in a magnificent way in Mary. If Jesus is the perfect expression of God's love, Mary is the foreshadowing of that love. If Jesus has brought the fullness of salvation, Mary is its dawning. www.franciscanmedia.org
