

A listening Church - A Synodal Church




Some of us may be following the Synod on Synodality that is taking place in Rome right now from 4 to 29 October, 2023. Some people say that it could be the most important event in the Catholic Church since Second Vatican Council (1962 - 1965).

There are many parallels between today's Gospel and the synod. Matthew 21: 9 -10: "'Go therefore to the main roads and invite to the wedding feast as many as you find.' And those servants went out into the roads and gathered all whom they found, both bad and good. So, the wedding hall was filled with guests."

The present 2021 - 2024 Synodal Process encourages us to "enlarge the space of our tent" (Isaiah 54:2) so everyone can fit into the Catholic Church. All are invited. We are all walking together. We are inclusive.

Pope Francis' September, 2023 prayer intention was "For people living on the margins". The pope invited everyone to: Pray for and assist people living on the margins of society. Pay attention to people who face marginalization, even if it results from poverty, addictions, mental illness, or disability. Specific examples: homeless people, street children washing car windshields, people with various disabilities. Offer a culture of welcoming, of providing shelter, of giving a home, of offering love, of giving human warmth. Help those living in subhuman living conditions. Welcoming is more than helping; it means putting the other person at our level.







More equality to women is one of the main topics being discerned at this October 2023 Synod. Listen to this story from Kenya called "We Women Are Equals and Have a Voice":


Research indicates that 75% of the members of Small Christian Communities (SCCs) in Nairobi Archdiocese in Nairobi, Kenya are women. In interviews Catholic women have said: "In the hierarchical, clerical Catholic Church in Kenya we women feel at the bottom. We are second class. This is reinforced by our traditional African customs and traditions where we are also second class. But in our weekly SCCs when we sit around in a circle and share our reflections on the Gospel of the following Sunday, we feel that we women are equals and have a voice."- thanks to Fr. Joseph Healey, MM

"To say yes to walk the synodal way is to be part of God's work, reknitting the fabric of our belonging – to God, to one another, to creation – as Christ's living body in the world. Whatever unfolds this month and as this process unfolds into the next year, through next October. Whatever the church continues to discern – the canonical changes, new juridical structures, and what ministerial reforms do or do not move ahead. Friends, let us stay grounded in the heart of the good news. The table has been set. The feast is prepared. So let us come clothed in the magnificence of the divinity dwelling within us. Let us come as we truly are: God's beloved clothed in the divinity that radiates with each and every child born". - CASEY STANTON



Feast Day: 18 October



New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the Gospel writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D. Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy
- 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation
- 3) The Gospel of the Poor
- 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation
- 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit
- 6) The Gospel of Joy.
