


12th November 2023 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wis 6:12-16 1 Thess 4:13-18 Mt 25:1-13

"By failing to prepare, you are preparing to fail." - Benjamin Franklin



We are approaching the end of the Liturgical Year and the readings - specifically through the Gospel - invite us to reflect upon the end of our lives. Amid the uncertainties of the world, a follower of Christ cannot afford to be casual and unprepared for the moment. In the Jewish culture of which the listeners and Jesus were a part, the custom was that the bride would wait with her bridesmaids, normally at the city gate, for the bridegroom to come and go to her house for the wedding feast. We must remember the conditions of travel then, with no mobile phones, that there would have been no way of knowing when the bridegroom would arrive. It would have been a great shame for the family of the bride not to be ready when the bridegroom arrived no matter how late it was.

Reflecting on the parable, one may think that it is unfair that the five foolish maids were excluded from the wedding simply because they forgot to bring sufficient Oil for their lamps. Another thing: why didn't the wise ones share some of their oil with them? Were they not guilty of rank selfishness? The parable is deeper than it seems. There is far more involved than a little lamp oil. It should be quite clear that we are not talking about a momentary lapse of memory – forgetting to bring

along some extra oil. What we are dealing with are two contrasting attitudes towards the wedding feast.

For the sensible women it was obviously the chance of a lifetime. It was something they really appreciated and for which they had prepared diligently. Here was a never-to-be-repeated opportunity to meet the bridegroom and to get into the wedding feast. No way were they going to miss it. For the foolish ones I imagine it was a bit of fun. They tagged along merely out of duty or habit. Deep down, they really did not care. Even so, they felt let-down when they did not get in. But it was their whole attitude that was wrong, not just one little lapse of concentration or memory. In other words, they were not judged on one moment of their lives. The first five were ready, careful, and wise – all doers of the word. The second five were unprepared, careless, and foolish – mere hearers of the word. Hence, we need to be the doers of the Word like the sensible women and not merely the hearers of the Word like the foolish women in the parable. The oil here stands for our

Faith (nourishing of our faith), our love and service for our fellow men and our life in the company of Jesus every day.

A stamp is told of an old and holy monk who

A story is told of an old and holy monk who was sweeping up the fallen leaves in the monastery grounds. A visitor saw him and asked, "What would you do, brother, if you knew that you were to die in ten minutes?" The old monk said, "I'd carry on sweeping." Because the monk has always been vigilant, he is ready to meet His Judge anytime.

In an emergency there are some things we can borrow from others at short notice. But we can also say in the context of today's parable that the 'oil' of

loving service is not transferable to others. Like if your mobile phone battery runs low, you cannot borrow the power from others... the battery power of your mobile phone is not transferable. In other words, our preparedness is something that is ultimately our responsibility.

The door was shut for the foolish women - not due to any partiality on the part of the bridegroom - but because of the tardiness/delay of some in responding to the invitation. The locked door means that access to Jesus is not automatic or to be altogether taken for granted. We need to ask for it and we need to make an effort to keep the oil of faith, hope and love

burning bright. And that is precisely the warning in today's parable - "Therefore, stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour." (Sources duly acknowledged)

St Elizabeth of Hungary

Feast Day: 17 November

The daughter of the King of Hungary, Elizabeth chose a life of penance and asceticism when a life of leisure and luxury could easily have been hers. The choice endeared her in the hearts of the common people throughout Europe. At the age of 14, Elizabeth was married to Louis of Thuringia, whom she deeply loved. She bore three children. Under the spiritual direction of a Franciscan friar, she led a life of prayer, sacrifice, and service to the poor and sick. Seeking to become one with the poor, she wore simple clothing. Daily she would take bread to hundreds of the poorest in the land who came to her gate. After six years of marriage, her husband died in the Crusades, and Elizabeth was grief-stricken. Her husband's family looked upon her as squandering the royal purse, and mistreated her, finally throwing her out of the palace. The return of her husband's allies from the Crusades resulted in her being reinstated, since her son was legal heir to the throne. In 1228, Elizabeth joined the Secular Franciscan Order, spending the remaining few years of her life caring for the poor in a hospital which she founded in honour of Saint Francis of Assisi. Elizabeth's health declined, and she died before her 24th birthday in 1231. **<u>Reflection:</u>** Elizabeth understood well the lesson Jesus taught when he washed his disciples' feet at the Last Supper. The Christian must be one who serves the humblest needs of others, even if one serves from an exalted position. Of royal blood, Elizabeth could have lorded it over her subjects. Yet she served them with such a loving heart that her brief life won for her a special place in the hearts of many. Elizabeth is also an example to us in her following the guidance of a spiritual director. Growth in the spiritual life is a difficult process.
