God's blessings to the graduates of Year 12 and Year 6! May they keep the faith alive in their hearts and may they have a colourful future! Parents, teachers – have a great and replenishing break. As Christmas is around the corner, people push themselves emotionally, physically and financially to be ready. The question is "Ready for what?"

Mother Mary helps us gain a new perspective and introspection about the mystery that we are celebrating every year! This mystery has little to do with the mad rush for the last gift; this mystery has little to do with traffic jams that test our patience... This mystery has little to do with the logistical balancing act of trying to figure out which gathering we should be noticed in...

This mystery has everything to do with noticing the sign still present today...the sign of a Virgin giving birth to the Messiah!

A small river fish that happened to reach the ocean said to an older fish, "Excuse me," "You are older than I, so can you tell me where to find this thing they call the ocean?" "The ocean," said the older fish "is the thing you are in now." "Oh, this? But this is only salty water. What I'm seeking is the ocean," said the disappointed fish as he swam away to search elsewhere. Today's gospel introduces God as Emmanuel, one living with us. Our Christmas celebration should enable us to experience this God within us and around us.



In the busyness of our life, there is the chance that "God-is-with us" can easily go unnoticed, ignored or so over sentimentalized that God cannot even be recognized...." Let us look around and see the events of our life in society and we could discern the presence of the Emmanuel... in the ordinariness of human life...Our life is punctuated with hardships, sickness and depression, disappointments, and failures... pushing us to the edge of life. Here is the story of Alejandra: 'I was feeling suicidal after my marriage broke down'. 'After two years of separation, the divorce papers were being drawn up. I asked my

mother to watch my children so I could be alone. She sensed I was in a dangerous place and suggested we go shopping instead. I had no energy to shop, so I stayed outside on a bench and contemplated the different ways I could end my life and stop the heartache I was feeling. 'Then a woman came and sat down next to me. "Are you a Christian?" she asked. I said I was. Then she said, "I just want to tell you that if you are a follower of Jesus, you are more than a conqueror in him." Bam! Those words breathed life into me. All thoughts of suicide left me and God's unexplainable peace rushed in. 'My husband and I will celebrate 26 years of marriage this year.'

Mary's acceptance of the risk, reproach and scandal gives our struggles at least some sense of meaning of direction. The celebration of this mystery brings to each person the opportunity of renewal. This celebration should help revive in us the hope that supports us when depression sets in.



We are part of God's big plan! Like Mary we are called to specific missions in life. These missions might be to be a faithful and faith-filled husband or wife, father or mother, grandma or grandpa. The mission may be to be a single man or woman with the time to extend God's love to others. The mission may be, right now, to be a holy widow or widower, offering the love cultivated during marriage to those around you. The mission may be to be a good little boy or girl, or a good teenager or young adult, learning how to love as God loves, sacrificially. When we do our best to respond to His call, we give evidence to His presence in the world. He calls us to be the house of His presence (Bethlehem). He calls us to radiate His reality to a world that looks for a

Saviour.



Gabriel spoke to Mary and the world waited for her answer. God speaks to each of us throughout our lives, and the world waits for our answers. For we are not Christians for ourselves, we are Christians to bring God to others and to serve God in others.

St. Francis said, "We are the mother of Christ when we carry him in our heart... and we give birth to him through our holy works which ought to shine on others by our example."

A strong man who

wavered for a moment, but then learned one cannot come to terms with evil, and so became a strong churchman, a martyr, and a saint—that was Thomas Becket, archbishop of Canterbury, murdered in his cathedral on December 29, 1170. His career had been a stormy one. While archdeacon of Canterbury, he was made chancellor of England at the age of 36 by his friend King Henry II. When Henry felt it advantageous to make his chancellor the archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas gave him fair warning: he might not accept all of Henry's intrusions into Church affairs. Nevertheless, in 1162 he was made archbishop, resigned his chancellorship, and reformed his whole way of life! Troubles began. Henry insisted upon usurping Church rights. At one time, supposing some conciliatory action possible, Thomas came close to compromise. He momentarily approved the Constitutions of Clarendon, which would have denied the clergy the right of trial by a Church court and prevented them from making direct appeal to Rome. But Thomas rejected the Constitutions, fled to France for safety, and remained in exile for seven years. When he returned to England he suspected it would mean certain death. Because Thomas refused to remit censures he had placed upon bishops favored by the king, Henry cried out in a rage, "Will no one rid me of this troublesome priest!" Four knights, taking his words as his wish, slew Thomas in the Canterbury cathedral. Thomas Becket remains a hero-saint down to our own times. https://


