## 1st Sunday of Advent

Is 63:16-17, 64:1,3-8 1 Cor 1:3-9 Mk 13:33-37

On Wednesday afternoon, our primary school here at St Madeleine's held a celebration in preparation for Advent. Each grade contributed something to the experience. There were plays, dances, recitals, prayers, and plenty of laughs. The teachers did a great job of putting it all together and the students were fantastic. As I was walking out, I noticed that some of the high school students were getting in on the fun as well, with one of them dressed in a Santa costume.

In our lives, we'll probably experience about 80-90 Advent seasons on average. As the years go on, there's always the chance that things become a little too routine, where we just go through motions, and where Advent becomes just another season of the year. For the children however, they're seeing Advent with fresh eyes, with new experiences and new learnings. I think there is something contagious about the joy they experience at this time of year, a reminder of the wonder and hope that Christ brings.

It's fitting that the end of the year brings with it a new beginning in Christ. Advent, from the latin *adventus*, means 'coming' or 'arrival.' We prepare now for the coming of baby Jesus in the manager. But Advent is more than just a preparation for Christmas. The Catechism stresses that there is a two-fold meaning of Advent, "for by sharing in the long preparation for the Saviors first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for His second coming," (No. 524). During Advent, we not only look back to the coming of the messiah in a manager, but we look forward to His second coming as well.

At the beginning of our Advent season this weekend, we will be lighting the first of four candles in our Advent wreath. The first candle encapsulates this idea of hope in the arrival of Jesus. This candle is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

And so, as we begin this Advent season, I pray that the hope of Christ is renewed afresh in you. As we prepare for Christ to come in a manager, may we also prepare for him to come into our hearts, so that one day we may meet with him in the coming of his heavenly glory.

May God bless you all, and a safe and happy week ahead.

## Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Feast Day: 8 December



A feast called the Conception of Mary arose in the Eastern Church in the seventh century. It came to the West in the eighth century. In the 11th century it received its present name, the Immaculate Conception. In the 18th century it became a feast of the universal Church. It is now recognized as a solemnity. In 1854, Pius IX solemnly proclaimed: "The most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instant of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin." It took a long time for this doctrine to develop. While many Fathers and Doctors of the Church considered Mary the greatest and holiest of the saints, they often had difficulty in seeing Mary as sinless—either at her conception or throughout her life. Two Franciscans, William of Ware and Blessed John Duns Scotus, helped develop the theology. They pointed out that Mary's Immaculate Conception enhances Jesus' redemptive work. Other members of the human race are cleansed from original sin after birth. In Mary, Jesus' work was so powerful as to prevent original sin at the outset Kingdom, an outgoing attitude that wants nothing more than to share the riches of Christ with all people. **<u>Reflection</u>** In Luke 1:28 the angel Gabriel, speaking on God's behalf, addresses Mary as "full of grace" or "highly favored". In that context, this phrase means that Mary is receiving all the special divine help necessary for the task ahead. The Spirit led the Church, especially non-theologians, to the insight that Mary had to be the most perfect work of God next to the Incarnation. Or rather, Mary's intimate association with the Incarnation called for the special involvement of God in Mary's whole life. The logic of piety helped God's people to believe that Mary was full of grace and free of sin from the first moment of her existence. Moreover, this great privilege of Mary is the highlight of all that God has done in Jesus.
