Deut 18:15-20 1 Cor 7:32-35 Mk 1:21-28

Dear Parishioners, please find below a commentary and reflection on this week's Gospel from one of Australia's most renowned biblical scholars, Fr Brendan Byrne - Fr Giovani

The readings this week reflect the Psalm response: O that today you would listen to his voice! Harden not your heart. This was the response of the Israelites when they grumbled at Meribah and Massah in the desert. In the First Reading, Moses promises the tribes of Israel that the Lord will send them a prophet like himself, coming from within their midst, who will speak God's words. We meet this prophet in the Gospel. It is Jesus himself, who amazes his audience in the synagogue by curing a man possessed by an unclean spirit. They are particularly impressed by Christ's quiet authority. In the Second Reading, Paul seeks to reassure his audience in Corinth. They are worrying about marriage in the wider context of the end of time, which they think is imminent. They, too, must give their undivided attention to the Lord and ensure everything is as it should be.

FIRST READING: Moses said to the people: 'The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly . . . and the Lord said to me, "I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The one who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."'

GOSPEL: Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply. 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new,' they said, 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

REFLECTION: I may be coming to pray from a need to feel close to the Lord today, or because I feel I ought to or must pray. Whatever my reason, I take some time to slow down. I pause awhile. When I am ready, I read the Gospel passage. It may be familiar, but I spend time with it and read it slowly as if for the first time.

After a while, I may find that the whole scene arises in my imagination. I am there with them. I see the people listening to Jesus, I hear the man shouting, I feel his touch as he tries to grab me to stop himself from falling. I look around me at the faces of the group. What do I notice particularly?

For a few moments, I recall all the sounds, the cries, the words which I've just heard. What are the key words for me? Maybe it's 'Be quiet!' or 'new teaching' or 'authority' . . . or something else? I wonder why these particular words are important to me just now. In what ways do they relate to my own life? I speak to the Lord, and explain how this scene has affected me today. Like the man in the synagogue, perhaps I also want to tell him – though gently and lovingly – 'I know who you are, the Holy One of God, in you I trust'.

Finally, I thank the Lord for being with me in my prayer today, and ask him to help all those around the world who suffer from poor mental health.

Brendan Byrne, SJ, FAHA, taught New Testament at Jesuit Theological College, Parkville, Vic., for almost forty years. He is now Emeritus Professor at the University of Divinity (Melbourne).

Presentation of the Lord

Feast Day: 2 February

At the end of the fourth century, a woman named

Etheria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Her journal, discovered in 1887, gives an unprecedented glimpse of liturgical life there. Among the celebrations she describes is the Epiphany, the observance of Christ's birth, and the gala procession in honor of his Presentation in the Temple 40 days later. Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification." Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or deathexcluded a person from Jewish worship. This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification. The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas. At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

Reflection In Luke's account, Jesus was welcomed in the temple by two elderly people, Simeon and the widow Anna. They embody Israel in their patient expectation; they acknowledge the infant Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. Early references to the Roman feast dub it the feast of Saint Simeon, the old man who burst into a song of joy which the Church still sings at day's end.had preserved it in the world."
