All who do not renounce their possessions cannot be my disciples

Wis 9:13-18, Philemon 9-10, 12-17, Lk 14:25-33

COMMENTARY: The readings this week are all about allowing God's love to guide every aspect of our lives. By turning to God for guidance, he will always keep us on the right path. The First Reading shows the gulf between God's ways and the ways of the world. We are reminded of the importance of staying connected to God's will and wisdom, and encouraged that this will be revealed to us through the Holy Spirit. The Psalm reminds us that the natural order of the world holds both beauty and disorder, death and renewal. In the same spirit, no matter what our faults and failings, God is infinitely patient, and forever inviting us to return to him. His mercy and love will endure. St Paul writes to his close friend, Philemon, in the Second Reading. Paul's heartfelt appeal on behalf of Philemon's runaway slave, Onesimus, reveals the new order of the Christian mission: that all are equal in the eyes of God. In the Gospel, Jesus highlights to his followers that the path of the Lord is not without suffering or sacrifice. It requires patience and courage, and an ability to put God's love above all things. As Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year, we are reminded that God is full of mercy and compassion. May this week's readings inspire and encourage us to take responsibility for understanding, upholding and sharing our Christian mission.

GOSPEL Luke 14: 25–33 At that time: Great crowds accompanied Jesus, and he turned and said to them, 'If anyone comes to me and does not hate their own father and mother, and wife and children, and brothers and sisters, yes, and even their own life, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not bear their own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, "This man began to build and was not able to finish."

Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace. So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that they have, cannot be my disciple.'

REFLECTION I come to my place of prayer, and slowly allow myself to become still. Then I turn to the text. I might want to place myself in the scene, perhaps as part of the great crowds following Jesus. I imagine the excitement and intensity of the situation. Perhaps I am trying to get Jesus's attention, or stand out above the rest? Perhaps I am happy simply to follow the crowd and observe? How do I react to Jesus's words? It might help to replace the word 'hate' with the alternative words 'forsake' or 'love . . less'. I spend time reflecting on what it means for me to respond to Jesus's call to love God above all things, even those relationships, possessions, positions and values that are very dear to me. I consider who and what guides my decisions and reactions. Do I have a tendency to defer to the opinions and values of others, rather than truly discerning what God is calling me to do? Perhaps there are times when I am impulsive or reactive? I talk to the Lord openly about whatever rises to the surface. Slowly, I reflect on how and when I might more actively take a breath, 'sit down', and listen to what God wants of me when I respond to particular situations.
