It seems that no one has returned to give thanks to God except this foreigner 2 Kg 5:14-17, 2 Tim 2:8-13, Lk 17:11-19

COMMENTARY: The readings this week focus on healing, gratitude, and giving thanks to the Lord for his goodness to all of us. Following the instructions of the prophet Elisha, Namaan, a Syrian general, is cured of his leprosy (First Reading). In gratitude, Namaan takes home with him some of the soil of Israel as a tangible reminder that he will from now on worship the one true God. The Psalm is a hymn to the universal kingship of God. The Lord has made known his salvation not only to Israel, but to all nations. The Second Reading encourages us to remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead. Although the person writing to Timothy is in prison and in chains, he is sure that the Lord's good news cannot be bound. Even if we are faithless, God will remain faithful. Returning to the theme of healing, the Gospel passage tells of the ten lepers who are cleansed of their leprosy. Only one of them, a Samaritan, goes back to Jesus to thank him. God's healing reaches beyond the people of Israel.

As Pilgrims of Hope in this Jubilee Year, we remember this week all those in need of healing, whether they openly acknowledge Christ or not. We also pray for all who are ostracised and marginalised by society.

GOSPEL Luke 17: 11–19 On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." When he saw them, he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus's feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."

REFLECTION Before reading this passage, I take time to become still in the way that suits me best. Perhaps I hold a cross or an object that means a lot to me. When I feel ready, I slowly read the text, several times. This is a familiar story and I can easily imagine the scene. Perhaps I look on from the margins or become one of the characters; or I may move from one person to another. I take time to watch in detail . . . the lepers, their sores, their clothes, their voice, their accent. I see Jesus, the way he looks at them, what he says to them. I remain there awhile, quite still. How do I feel? Perhaps sad at the way lepers are treated . . .? comforted by the reaction of Jesus . . .? annoyed at the lepers' lack of gratitude . . .? encouraged by the thanks of the Samaritan . . .? Eventually, I return to my own surroundings in the present moment. I ponder. Who are the people around me who feel marginalised, ostracised today? How far can I say that 'the creed and the colour and the name don't matter' to me, when people need a friendly hand? I may be able to recall an instance in my own life when I received healing and support after being shunned by others. Who did I turn to? Whether or not I expressed my gratitude like the Samaritan on that occasion, I speak with the Lord about it in my own words, trusting that he always understands.

Inspired and guided by the Holy Spirit and the Gospel, St Madeleine Sophie Barat Parish, a community of faith and service, strives to be a witness for Christ's love far and wide, reflecting the humility and wisdom of St Madeleine, the Patroness of the parish.


